Sir,

I am directed to refer to Resolution XV, relating to

the education of girls, passed at the conference, held at -

Simla in July, 1912, on the education of the domiciled -

community, and to state that it is proposed to hold a -

conference in Bombay of the heads of European girls' -

schools in order to consider the points mentioned in -

clause (iv) of the Resolution and also the expediency of -

altering the Code of Regulations for European Schools in -

force in this Presidency so as to admit of girls receiving

more general culture and a more thorough course of - - -

domestic science instead of or as an alternative to prepar-

-ing for a University course.

2. I am to state that the Government of Bombay -
consider that the presence at the proposed conference, if -
it could be arranged for, of the Inspector of European -

Schools,

Schools, Madras, would be most helpful. It is understood -

that the Madras Educational Department have been engaged with

problems somewhat similar to those which the conference will -

be asked to discuss. It also appears that the Madras

Inspector was an Inspector in England till about two years ago, ^(*) of Reformatory & industrial schools

in which case he is no doubt acquainted with the most recent -

developments in English schools. He would thus be able to give

useful advice and assistance at the Conference. It is - - -

suggested that he might derive some benefit from a visit to -

the European Schools in Bombay where he could be shown what

improvements are in contemplation.

3. I am accordingly to state that the Bombay Govern-
ment would be very glad if, with the permission of His Excel-
lency the Governor in Council, it could be arranged that the
Inspector of European Schools, Madras, should be deputed to -
attend the conference which it is proposed to hold in Bombay -
in the course of August next, and I am to request that I may
be informed whether such an arrangement is possible.
