The humble petition of Muhammad
Abdus Sathar, 2nd Clerk, District &
Sessions Court, Kurnool.

Most Respectfully Sheweth as follows:--

I beg most humbly and respectfully to submit the following for your Lordships' consideration.

2. I am a Muhammadan Matriculate of the Madras University and have passed the Translation Test in Telugu (Lower Grade) and in Hindustani (Higher Grade). I have put in more than twenty years' service in the Judicial Department in the Kurnool District and have gained good experience of civil and criminal work in all its branches. I worked as a clerk (Bench clerk included) in the District Munsif's Courts in the Kurnool District for about eight years and acted as Record Keeper on Rs.50 in the District Court, Kurnool. Copies of my testimonials are submitted for Your Lordships' kind perusal. I am the only Muhammadan passed candidate in the Civil Department in the Kurnool District, and am the permanent 2nd clerk of the -- District Court, Kurnool, on Rs.40. I have a big family depending on me in these days of scarcity.

3. My father-in-law was the Sheristadar of the Kurnool

District Court

District Court, till he retired in 1899. My maternal uncle is a retired 1st class Police Inspector, who was a distinguished detective Police Officer, and his son is a Deputy Superintendent of Police (titled Khan Sahib) who has married from the Karnatic Nawab's family in Madras. My sister's husband is a retired Forest Ranger, and my father was an Amin in the District Court, Nellore. Thus all my relatives held, or are holding, respectable posts under this benign Government.

4. Now, the post of the Head Clerk in a District Munsif's Court in the Kurnool District has fallen permanently vacant. I have passed all the tests (except the Civil Judicial Test) necessary for that Head Clerk's post. I appeared twice for that wanting test, but unfortunately without success. Official work and family circumstances make the passing of that test a matter of considerable difficulty now. If I had passed the Civil Judicial test, I should have the best claims for the vacant post, being the most senior clerk on Rs.40. But vacancies in higher grades in the Civil Department being rare, I shall have to wait long long before the next vacancy occurs, if I let go the present chance.

5. In these circumstances I pray most humbly and respectfully that your Lordships will be pleased to move the Government to exempt me from passing the Civil Judicial test. The Government have been most mercifully pleased to grant several exemptions in -- favour of Muhammadans. One of them was an unpassed man of the -- Kurnool District who did not know English but who was exempted for the post of Deputy Nazir on Rs.25. I humbly beg that I may be recommended for the kindness of Government and I humbly submit that, as I have twenty years' experience and as I am a Matriculate with Translation test in two languages of the District, the rule requiring the Civil Judicial test may be easily and safely relaxed in

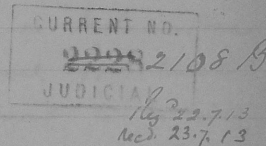
