Approving the proposals of the Director of Public Instruction for the distribution of a subsidy of Rs. 11,96,500 to certain district boards and municipal councils for the construction of elementary school buildings, and sanctioning the payment of Rs. 3,500 to the Māvavaram municipality for the formation of a common garden and museum for the elementary schools in the town.

I have the honour to propose the distribution to local boards and municipalities of the amounts detailed in the appended statement, for expenditure on the construction of elementary school buildings and their equipment.

2. I consulted all the Presidents of district boards and Chairmen of municipal councils upon the matter and have received proposals involving an expenditure of Rs. 14,67,936 excluding the amount available for re-allotment out of the subsidies paid during 1912-13. The amount available for re-allotment is reported to be Rupees 5,66,387, out of which the Presidents and Chairmen require Rs. 1,74,453 for completion of 142 buildings commenced during 1912-13. They also propose to spend on equipment a sum of Rs. 1,17,957. The balance of Rs. 2,73,972 together with the amount referred to above, viz., Rs. 14,67,936, or making a total of Rs. 17,41,908 is intended to provide buildings for 896 existing schools, the necessity having been urged in each case by the inspecting officers. These schools comprise—

Board schools for boys	619
Do. for girls	57
Municipal schools for boys	204
Do. for girls	16

The average cost is about Rs. 1,570 in rural areas and Rs. 3,100 in towns.

3. To keep within the budget limit, I have in several cases cut down the amount to be paid this year, the reduction being effected in cases where more buildings have been proposed than are likely to be constructed during the year. The total subsidy now proposed amounts to Rs. 11,96,500, i.e., Rs. 7,94,000 for district boards and Rs. 4,02,500 for municipalities. The balance of the claims, viz., Rs. 2,71,436, may be paid during 1914-15, out of the non-recurring portion of the Imperial grant (*vide* G.O. No. 264, Educational, dated 27th March 1913).

4. The amount available for construction of elementary school buildings during the current year is Rs. 12,12,000, i.e., Rs. 8,00,000 from the Imperial grant and Rs. 4,12,000, the allotment in the civil budget estimate. Out of this Rs. 6,100 has already been sanctioned for the Palni municipality in G.O. No. 420, Educational, dated 8th May 1913. Including the proposals now submitted the total expenditure will come to Rs. 12,02,600, leaving a balance of Rs. 9,400.

5. Out of this balance, the sum of Rs. 3,500, recommended in my N. Ref. on Cur. No. 422/13, dated 15th February 1913, for the formation of a common garden and museum for all the elementary schools in the Mayavaram municipality, may be sanctioned. This will leave a balance of Rs. 5,900 for any unforeseen or urgent demands.

[SUBJECT.—*Distribution of subsidies to district boards and municipalities for the construction of elementary school buildings and their equipment.*]

From the Director of Public Instruction, No. 2462, dated 19th July 1913.

One of the proposals for the distribution of the special Imperial grant of 23 lakhs for education approved in G.O. No. 264, Educational, dated 27th March 1913, is the allotment of 8 lakhs for the construction of buildings for board and municipal schools; and in the Civil Budget estimate for 1913-14 there is available a sum of Rs. 4,12,000 * included in the lump provision of Rupees 4,16,567 + under 45-A. Civil Buildings—

† The balance of Rs. 4,567 is for the Kulittalai Board High school—page 619 of the Budget notes for 1913-14.

In charge of Civil officers for grants for educational buildings. The total amount thus available for distribution is Rupees 12,12,000.

As regards items (1) and (2) it is submitted that the Director's distribution, which must be based on actual requirements, may be accepted. As regards item (3) attention is invited to pages 1 to 6 of notes in another file, from which it will be seen that a sum of Rs. 3,500 has been noted towards the formation of a garden and museum for the use of elementary schools in Mayavaram. The sum required for improvements to the high school play-ground (Rs. 4,000) cannot be brought under the present distribution as it relates to secondary education. The balance then left will be Rs. 5,900 as shown below :—
