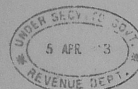

I

Letter from P.M.Lushington Esq., Conservator of Forests,
Central Circle, No.448/1913, dated 15th February 1913:--

Under the Public Service Notification issued in 1908
certain clerks and among them my permanent Manager M.R.Ry.
K.Gundu Rao and permanent Tour Clerk M.R.Ry. T.Ramachandra

second clerk.

Rao were required to pass the Account Test Higher and the Forest Departmental Test.

According to Government Order No.54 dated 31st January 1910 and Government Order No.431 dated 22nd July 1910 time was given to them up to the end of October 1912 to pass the Departmental Test failing which they should be reduced.

2. I cannot however imagine that these Government Orders are intended to apply to such men as those referred to.

M.R.Ry. K.Gundu Rao entered the service in 1884 and worked his way up through the office and being an exceptionally brilliant clerk acted as Manager in 1892 and was confirmed in that appointment in 1894, 14 years prior to the issue of the Public Service Notification. I have no hesitation in saying both from personal knowledge and also from the remarks made in the Service Register that he is the most capable Manager in the Department. His age is 51.

M.R.Ry. T.Ramachandra Rao entered the service in 1883 and acted as Tour Clerk in 1892 and was confirmed in that appointment in 1898, 10 years prior to the Notification referred to above.

His work has been invariably satisfactory and he has never failed to obtain the yearly increment. His age is 50.

He was exempted from the translation test in Government Order No.180/Mis. dated 18th March 1898.

3. It is always hard to obtain good men in a small office like that of the Conservators and it would in my opinion be little short of a calamity if such deserving men were reduced because they failed to pass examinations at an advanced age.

4. Under these circumstances I request that their case may be referred to Government with a view to permanent exemption.

II

Board's Reference No. 447/13-1, dated 1st March 1913:--

The Conservator is requested to report whether Messrs. Gundu Rao and Ramachandra Rao proposed to be exempted tried their best to pass the examinations in question during the four years from 1909 to 1912, and to submit applications in the prescribed form for their permanent exemption.

2. The Board understands that M.R.Ry.T.Ramachandra Rao who has put in a service of about 29 years is now on long leave. The Conservator is requested to state whether the leave has been granted to him preparatory to retirement and

if so, whether it is not sufficient to obtain temporary exemption in his ^{Case} ~~case~~ up to date of his retirement. The Board understands that M.R.Ry. Gundu Rao is returning to duty.

III

Letter from H.B.Bryant Esq., Conservator of Forests,
Central Circle, C No.448/13 dated 15th March 1913:---

With reference to the above, I have the honour to submit herewith the form called for and to state that both M.R.Ry. K.Gundu Rao and T.Ramachandra Rao who were on furlough were recalled to duty by me in the interests of the service and they have since rejoined.

2. I understand from M.R.Ry. K.Gundu Rao and Ramachandra Rao that they never attempted to pass the tests before as they were clearly given to understand by the late Conservator, Mr.Brasier that the new rules prescribing the Account Test (Higher) and Departmental Test for their posts did not apply to their cases in as much as they were confirmed in their posts several years before the rules came into force. It appears also Mr.Brasier expressed his opinion that it was not usual to give retrospective effect to new rules and the

Board is itself of opinion that it would not be fair to do so.

3. I fully endorse the opinion of my predecessor contained in this office letter No.448 dated 15th February 1913 and strongly recommend that both M.R.Ry. K.Gundu Rao and Ramachandra Rao may be exempted permanently from passing the tests. They have completed their pensionable service but both are capable and competent men and so long as they are able to ~~carry~~ carry out their duties satisfactorily I submit that it is in the interests of the Public Service that they should be permitted to do so, if they so desire.

Reference

The application for permanent exemption from the Account Test and the Forest Departmental Test received from the Conservator of Forests, Central Circle with his letter last read above on behalf of M.R.Ry.K.Gundu Rao and M.R.Ry. T.Ramachandra Rao, Manager and Tour Clerk respectively of the Conservator's Office, will be submitted for the orders of Government.

2. M.R.Ry. K.Gundu Rao entered service in 1884; he was appointed as Ag. Manager of the Conservator's Office in 1892, and was confirmed in that post in 1894. M.R.Ry. T.Ramachandra Rao entered service in 1883; he was appointed as Ag.Tour clerk in 1892 and was confirmed in that appointment in 1898, Govern-

ment having, in their order Edl. No.180 dated 18-3-1898, E
permanently exempted him from passing the Translation Test,
Lower Grade. The Account Test, Higher Grade, and the Depart-
mental Test in Forest Code and Accounts and B.S.Os. were pres-
cribed for the posts of Managers and Tour clerks of Conser-
vator's Offices in the years 1908, 1909 and 1910 long after
the confirmation of these officers in their present posts. It
was in consideration of this fact that Government exempted them
from the special Tests in question for a period of 3 years from
1910 to 1912 in order that they might duly qualify themselves
within that period.

In his letter last read above the Conservator reports that
the two applicants made no attempt to pass the tests in question
as they were given to understand by his predecessor Mr. Brasier,
that it was not usual to give retrospective effect to new
rules in the Public Service Notification and that the rule pres-
cribing the tests did not apply to them. The Board held the
same view in its reference No. Forests 3438/11-1, dated 12-1-12 G.O. No. 174 Edl. 28-2-12
while recommending the permanent exemption of M.R. Ry. M. Andl, (flag X)
Head Clerk, District Forest Office, South Malabar, from the
tests in question and Government were pleased to accord the
exemption sought for, - Vide G.O. No. 174 Edl. dated 28-2-1912. X (in lines file)

3. The present case is on all fours with that disposed of
in the G.O. mentioned above (G.O. No. 174 Edl. dated 28-2-1912).
The present Conservator Mr. H.B. Bryant and his predecessor Mr.
P.M. Lushington, have testified to the exceptionally good work
of the two applicants from the beginning of their service,
and have certified that it will be in the interests of the
Public Service to exempt them permanently from the tests.
The Board supports the Conservators' recommendation.
