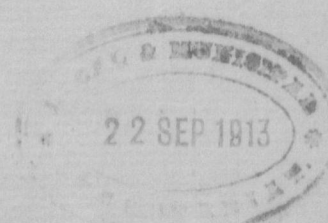

2. In my telegram of 14th February last I expressed the view that it does not necessarily follow from the appointment of the Royal Commission that minor proposals regarding the pay of the Educational Services which you think are urgently required must be suspended. I shall be prepared to give sympathetic consideration to such recommendations as Your Excellency's Government may make for affording temporary relief to members of the Indian Educational Service, pending the result of the Royal Commission's deliberations. I shall await the detailed proposals which you promise to submit shortly. Meanwhile, if you think fit, the officers whose memorials are now forwarded, and any others who may submit memorials to the same effect, may be referred to paragraph 53 of the Resolution of Your Excellency's Government, No. 301 C.D., dated 21st February last, and may be informed that measures for affording temporary relief are under consideration, and will, when the details are settled, be put into effect without prejudice to the recommendations of the Royal Commission.
