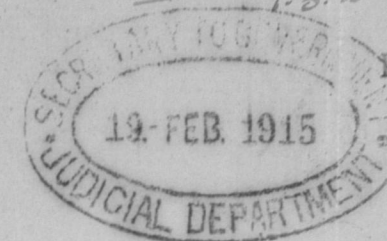

My dear Diwan Bahadur,

Owing to the recall of officers it is understood that the number of members of the Indian Civil Service available in certain provinces is unusually large. It has occurred to the Government of India that the opportunity might be taken to employ a few such officers temporarily in educational work. Several of the departments of public instruction appear from correspondence recently received to be suffering from a dearth of men; and difficulty is anticipated in recruiting for the Indian Educational Service so long as the war lasts. In any case where members of the Civil Service are available it might be a beneficial arrangement to lend officers temporarily to a service which is generally understaffed. Possibly Local Governments might consider a period of educational work to be a good training for a young officer and well calculated to interest him in a subject with which, in his capacity as a District Magistrate or in higher posts, he will be largely concerned during his service. Such training is likely to be specially useful in the near future when educational problems are bound to take a prominent place and the extensive schemes of improvement and expansion already framed by Local Governments come to be carried into effect.

2. Such appointments would be only temporary and supernumerary and would not interfere with the existing appointments held by, or the claims of, the Indian Educational Service or Provincial Educational Service. There is a general dearth of inspectors of schools, who are particularly required at the present moment to carry out the work of organisation of primary education. The

inspecting staff for secondary schools is also notoriously weak in numbers.

3. It is not suggested that there should be any formal deputation to the Educational Service of officers so selected, or that any allowances should be given. An officer placed on inspecting work in his own province would merely change the nature of his duties temporarily without change of status.

Under the needs of the Educ. Dept. here are pressing as to which the Educ. Sec. will no doubt note, I am opposed to transferring any Civilians to Educ. duties.

The only persons Civilians without Divisions at present are Messrs. Thorne, Ramanamurti & Robertson. The last is required at Bellary just at present to look after the German Settlement & he & Mr. Thorne are likely to be wanted very soon for Div. changes. Mr. Ramanamurti is specially wanted at Tuticorin to give some help to Mr. Pate. Besides, if leave is reopened to any extent, & it seems that it has been, we shall certainly need all the passed men we have got.

As to the unemployed men they are far better employed learning their work than performing Educ. duties.

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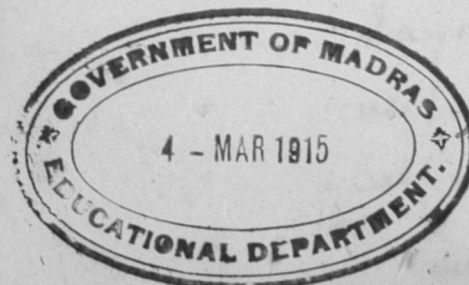
I do not think there is any scope for a civilian in college work unless one could be appointed instead of the additional professor to relieve the Principal of the Presidency College of teaching work. As things are likely to be a History man will be wanted for this and civilians are not commonly very strong in this. Besides some experience of teaching work seems essential.

One or two civilians might be appointed as additional inspectors in heavy circles. They would then probably have work with both secondary and elementary schools.

They would feel the want of teaching experience here also. Inspectors are supposed to have had this before coming out and also some professional experience.

I am however by no means opposed to the scheme being given a trial. Something might result from the contact of fresh minds with educational facts and problems.

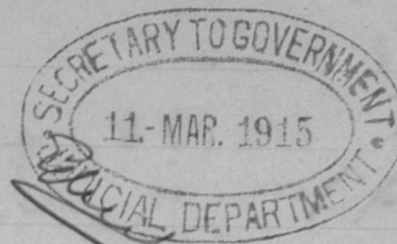

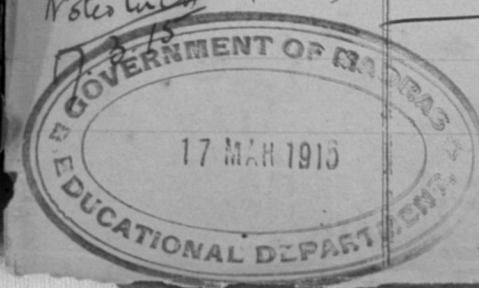
