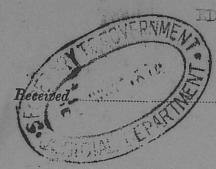

With reference to G.Os. Nos. 1252 Educational, dated 19th November 1914 and 595 Educational, dated 7th June 1915 approving the proposals for the establishment of a Government College at Anantapur, I have the honour to propose that the College be started on 1st July and that provision be made for the present for imparting instruction in Parts I and II of the Intermediate Course and in Group III only, of Part III the subjects to be taken up in that Group being History, Logic, Telugu and Sanskrit. I gather from the tabulated results of the Secondary School Leaving Certificate Public Examination held

held in March last that the total number of candidates in the Ceded Districts eligible for admission to the Intermediate Class in Groups I, II and III is 37, of whom about 13 might be expected to take Group I and 22 Group III. It is clearly impossible to provide for instruction in Group I in the college this year owing to the inability of the Public Works Department to provide the necessary equipment, which I have already brought to the notice of Government in my letter R.O. No. 3322 of 1914, dated 10th April 1916, and this is why it is proposed to afford instruction this year in Group III only. Government have approved using for the college classes some rooms in the new building which is being constructed for the Municipal High School and the necessary orders have issued in the Public Works Department on this matter.

2. The undermentioned staff will be immediately necessary besides the pandits and the clerical and menial establishments :-

I propose to appoint M.R. Ry. S.L. Ranganathan, M.A., L.T., Junior Professor of English, Presidency College, as Principal and Senior Lecturer, one of the Assistant Professors of Philosophy in the Subordinate Collegiate Service as the Junior Lecturer on Rs. 250/- and an experienced and competent History Graduate as the third Lecturer. M.R. Ry. Ranganathan is at present second in the eighth grade of the Provincial Educational Service and is likely to be promoted to the 7th grade on Rs. 300/- at latest in August next in consequence of the

the retirement of Mr. Malim which took place on 1st April last and that of T.S. Muhammad Hussain Sahib Bahadur in August next. As the sanctioned scale of pay for the post of Principal of the college is Rs. 300/- Ranganathan will not in any way be benefited by the transfer as he should be in view of the additional responsibilities that would devolve on him as Principal of the college. I beg to recommend therefore that he be granted a personal allowance of Rs. 100/- per mensem with effect from the date of his joining the post. I may mention in this connection that if the college is to be affiliated to the University and worked successfully it is essential that the Principal should be a very good man and that I cannot think of any one else than Ranganathan in the lower grades of the Provincial Educational Service with the combined scholarship and organizing power required for the office of Principal. He is a First Class M. A. in English and also a First Class L.T.

The extra charge involved can be met from the savings under the provision for salaries for the college in the current year's budget.

I am aware that these proposals may be criticised as uneconomical. If however the new college is to have any chance of success it must be started with a staff which will command complete confidence. As noted above the number of students that can enter the college this year direct from the schools of the Ceded Districts is limited and of course some of these for one reason or another will not join it. There has been, however, a large number of failures in the Intermediate Examination and it may be anticipated that some of these will wish to join so that a small senior class

might be formed at once. I think the staff proposed which is the same as that for the Government Women's College which has been teaching two classes should suffice for this. The Principal should enter on his duties as soon as possible as he will have to make admissions.

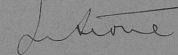
3. Nothing is said in G.O. No. 1252 Educational, dated 9th November 1914 as to the status of the posts of Principal and Senior Lecturer and Junior Lecturer which are to be outside the cadre of the Provincial Educational Service. But on the analogy of similar posts in the Presidency, Kumbakonam and Teachers' Colleges I would include them in the list of gazetted appointments. On receipt of the orders of Government on this communication I shall submit the usual recommendation rolls for the approval of His Excellency the Governor.

SUBJECT.

Proposals for opening the H.A. College at Anantapur.

The first question that has to be considered is the groups in which instruction should be imparted. The original idea was that instruction must be provided in at least groups (i) and (ii) of Part-III of the Intermediate course. The Director now reports that it is impossible to provide for instruction in group (i) this year owing to the inability of the P.W.D. to provide the necessary equipment. He suggests that History, Logic, Telugu and Sanskrit may for the present be taught in the College. This proposal may be approved.

2. The second question for consideration is the staff to be immediately employed. The staff proposed by him in 1914 is compared below with that now suggested.

From the above it will be seen that the staff now proposed for teaching English, History and Logic is numerically one more than that proposed for similar subjects in 1914. The addition is apparently intended in view of the proposal to open ~~simultaneously~~ a senior class simultaneously with the junior intermediate class. If so, the staff proposed seems unobjectionable.

3. The next question to be examined is the scale of pay proposed for the staff. The Director's ~~suggests~~ proposal to pay for the pay of the junior lecturer in English at Rs. 250 as in the original proposals approved in L.P. no. 1252 Edl., dated the 9th November 1914 may be accepted.

No pay has been proposed for the third lecturer (in History) as the posts of subordinate lecturers are ~~to be~~ included in the cadre of the subordinate educational service, collegiate branch - para. 3, page 3 of L.P. no. 1252 Edl., dated the 9th November 1914.

Forfeiture and the clerical and menial establishments the Director will obviously adopt the scale sanctioned in L.P. no. 1252 Edl., dated the 9th November 1914.

The Director suggests that a personal allowance of Rs. 100 may be granted to the Principal in addition to the pay of Rs. 300 fixed for the post, in view of the fact that the officer selected for the appointment will not have any ~~other~~ pay for the additional responsibilities devolving on him. notes with Lys no 1252 Ed., dated the 9th November 1914 in which it was printed out that the pay of the Principal (Rs. 300) was moderate as compared with that proposed for the headmasters of model high schools in 1910. It is, however, observed that no personal allowances have till now been sanctioned for Principals of Govt. Colleges except in the case of the Women's College, where the allowance is specially justifiable in view of the fact that the pay of the Principal and the Professor is the same.

In 1913 the Govt. of India of their own motion wanted proposals from Local Govts. for the creation of allowances for principals of colleges in view of the responsibilities attaching to these posts. This Govt. in that connection ~~suggested~~ ^{depreciated} the grant of an allowance to each of the principals ^(as such but suggested the increase of principal allowances in India) of the Govt. colleges in this Presidency. ~~The Secretary~~

College, but this proposal as such was disallowed by the Govt.

It may also be noted that Mr. N. R. Krishnam was an officer in the P. S. now drawing Rs. 300 has been appointed to act as Principal of the Mangalore College without any extra allowance. There does not therefore appear to be any strong ground for the grant of a personal allowance to Mr. Ranganatham who is proposed for the Principalship of the Anantapur College. Further if Mr. Ranganatham is appointed now he will, until he is proposed for promotion, be drawing an extra Rs. 50 over his present pay. Financial may be consulted.

4. With reference to para. 3 of the Director's letter he may be informed that the posts of the Principal and senior lecturers and the junior lecturers may be included in the list of gazetted appointments.

A draft order is submitted for approval. It does not seem necessary to ^{at present} ~~give~~ specific sanction to the employment of the establishment as the ~~same~~ Govt. have approved of it in G.O. no 1252 Ed., dated the 9th November 1914.

Regarding the proposal to grant ^{to} an allowance to the Principal, it will appear from the D.P.D.'s note overleaf that the reason for the proposal was that ~~the~~ he had submitted recommendations for allowance for certain other officers. These allowances have ^{been} disallowed as such, and the Director has been asked to submit the cases of real hardship for special treatment. It does not seem that the Director desires to press his original proposal to grant an allowance to Mr. Rangguetham; and there is little likelihood of his doing so if he receives the order of forbearance in respect of his funeral proposal. The Director's proposal to pay an allowance to Mr. Rangguetham has to be disposed of in the order that is

(i) Third lecturer of the College - It seems necessary to specify in the draft the grade of the Subordinate Collegiate service, in which an appointment should be created on account of the third lecturer. The appointment may be in the last (Rs 100) grade, any officer ^{suitable} ~~being~~ being deputed for the present work, if necessary.

(ii) Grain Compensation allowance - The clerk, librarian, attenders and peons may all be declared ineligible for g. c. a.

4. Subject to modifications with reference to para 3 above, the draft order may, it is submitted, be accepted.

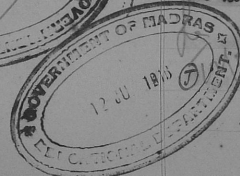
