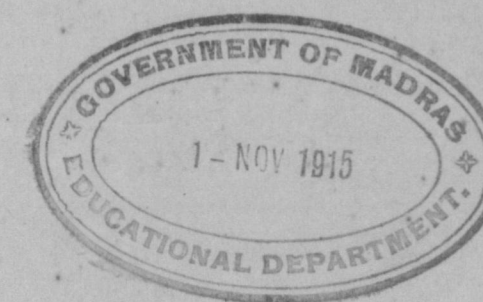

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR'S TOUR, 1915.

Extract from an address to be presented to His Excellency the Governor by the Trichinopoly District Board.

13. We are maintaining three secondary schools in the district, those of Nāmakkal, Kulittalai and Lalgudi. The Lalgudi school buildings have to be improved at a very early date. We have recently addressed the Director of Public Instruction in the matter of a grant for this purpose being recommended for your Excellency's consideration. There is an importunate appeal before us for the conversion of the Ariyalur primary school into a secondary one. All these mean expenditure of money.

EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT.

The three schools referred to above are all complete secondary schools teaching up to the sixth form. The following statement shows the strength of the schools on 31st March 1914 and the expenditure connected with the schools in 1913-14:—

In the administration report of the District Board of Trichinopoly for 1914-15, it was stated that the question of providing additional accommodation for the Lalgudi school was engaging the attention of the Trichinopoly Taluk Board. The proposals have not yet reached Government. They will receive consideration when received. In view, however, of the recent instructions of the Government of India to observe strict

economy throughout and to postpone all additional expenditure which may be postponed without grave inconvenience, it is unlikely that it will be possible to pay any grant as long as the war continues. Perhaps the District Board may be advised to renew their application after the close of the war and meanwhile to see whether the inhabitants of the localities which benefit by the schools are not prepared to subscribe towards their improvement.

3. No specific request is made concerning the proposal to convert the Ariyalur primary school into a secondary one, nor has any reached Government till now. Presumably the proposal has not yet matured. The primary function of the District Board is to extend elementary education and to undertake the spread of secondary education only if the funds of the Board permit such a course. The policy of Government in regard to secondary education is to encourage, as far as possible, the establishment of aided institutions. If additional secondary schools are to be opened, it will thus be for private agency to move in the matter first; and if this is not possible and if the needs of secondary education are pressing, the Local Board may consider the proposal and apply to Government for assistance if necessary.

4. The note is forwarded to the Local and Municipal Department for remarks, if any.

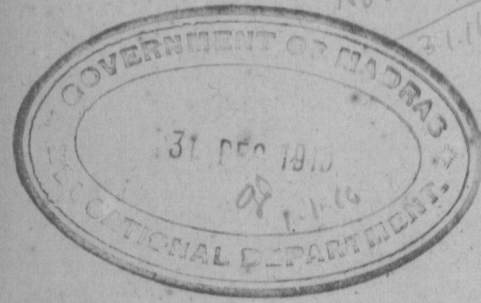
