The humble petition of N. Doraiswami Ayyar, Clerk
District Munsif's Court, Paramakudi, most respectfully
showeth:-

That the petitioner has put in a service of nearly
7 years in the Department and has passed the following
Special Tests viz., The Civil Judicial Test and Transla-
tion test (lower grade).

That the petitioner being only a matriculate could
not apply for the Criminal Judicial Test lower grade which
is also a qualification required to make him eligible for
all the appointments in the Department.

That during the past 7 years of his service in the
Department your honor's humble petitioner has gained suffi-
cient knowledge in all ^{the} branches of work and has been ~~att~~
attending to the most important and heavy work in the Para-
makudi District Munsif's court viz., Original Execution for
the past 5 years. He has also had an opportunity to act
as Head clerk of that Court for a short time.

That your honor's humble petitioner begs that he is
confident of getting through the Criminal Judicial Test
(lower grade) ^{as} if he is given opportunity to apply therefor
and that a perusal of the Fort Saint George Gazette dated
11th December 1916 which contains a list of successful
candidates in the said list will show that exemption is
ordinarily granted even to clerks of the lower grade in the
Judicial Department.

humbly prays that your honor may be graciously pleased to
extend your generosity and get him permission to apply
for the Criminal Judicial Test lower grade and thus protect
him.

It is submitted that there
are no definite orders on the subject.
In the present case the applicant
being only a matriculate cannot
without the special permission of
Court: appear for the terminal
judicial test, lowest grade - vide note (2)
to Art. 4 of the Special Test Notification.
In matters like these the recent
policy has been to defer to the wishes
of heads of depts: and permission
to appear for special tests is seldom
if ever, refused provided the
application is ~~properly~~ recommended.
