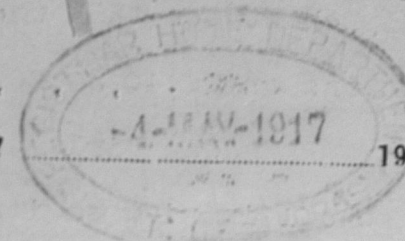

Sir,

The Anjuman-i-Ahlei Hadis, Madras, has submitted
to me a petition from the Muhammadan residents in the Perambur
Barracks praying for the opening of a Government Muhammadan Girls'
school at Perambur, as a school for the education of Muslim girls
is badly wanted there. The Inspectress of Girls' schools, Central
Circle, to whom the petition was referred reports that a school for
Muhammadan girls is wanted in the locality, that about 40 pupils
are likely to attend if one is opened and that a house for its
accommodation is available on a rent of Rs.20/- per mensem and she
accordingly recommends the opening of a Government Muhammadan girls'
Elementary school at Perambur with two teachers, one on Rs.20/- and

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and the other on Rs.12/- per mensem and a peon on Rs.9/- per mensem. In this connection, Miss. Lynch states that the full complement of the staff of six teachers on Rs.40,30,20,15 and 2(12) sanctioned for the Government Muhammadan Girls' school, Mylapore, is not required for that school in view of its present strength and average attendance and that two of the sanctioned posts viz., one on Rs.20/- and the other on Rs.12/- may be transferred from that school to the proposed school at Perambur as Headmistress and First assistant, together with one of the conductresses on Rs.3/- per mensem.

2. The proposal commends itself to me and I have the honour accordingly to request that you will be so good as to obtain the sanction of Government for the opening of the school as a temporary measure for a period of one year from the 1st July '17 and for the employment therein of two teachers one on Rs.20/- and the other on Rs.12/- per mensem by transferring to it the corresponding posts and a post of conductress on Rs.3/- per mensem from the Government Muhammadan Girls' school, Mylapore, and of a peon on Rs.9/- per mensem without claim to Grain Compensation Allowance.

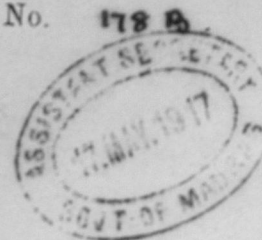

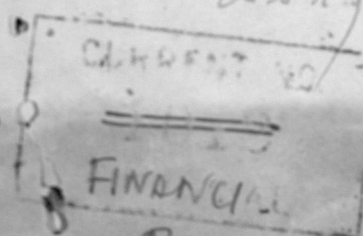
SUBJECT. Opening of an elementary girls' school for Muhammadans at Perambur.

The D.P.'s proposal to open an elementary school for Muhammadan girls at Perambur which involves an extra expenditure of Rs 35 (per mensem) or Rs 420 (per annum) may, it is submitted, be approved. A draft order is submitted for approval. If approved, it may be forwarded to the Financial Department for acceptance.

The proposal to open a new elementary school for Muhammadan girls at Perambur need not, it is submitted, be objected to, but the D.P.'s may, it is submitted, be informed that the expenditure on account of this school should be taken against the sum of 1.21 lakhs provided in the budget for 1917-18 for opening new elementary

elementary schools and strengthening existing elementary schools."

2. Scale of expenditure proposed for the new school:-

The total expenditure comes to Rs 70 per mensem, as follows:-

(a) Headmistress	Rs 20	* = 35
(b) Assistant	12	
(c) Conductress	3	
(d) Peon	9 (without G.C.A.)	
(e) Rent	20	
(f) Contingencies	6	
Total	Rs 70	

Note: [* Will be provided by transfer from the Mahammadau Girls' School, Mylapore] So net extra cost to Govt is Rs 35 p. m.]

(i) Items (c), (e) and (f) call for no remarks.

(ii) Items (a) & (b):- For a Mahammadau Girls' School where the sanctioned staff is only 2 teachers, the rate of pay ordinarily allowed is only 1(15) & 1(12); it is for orders whether these rates may not be adhered to in the present case, any teacher on higher pay transferred to this school from the Mahammadau Girls' School, Mylapore, being compensated for the loss by a personal allowance.

also quite clear. It will be seen that
a conductress on Rs 3 per mensem is
proposed to be employed. It is for orders
whether in the absence of sufficient
justification for the peon's post it
should be sanctioned.

3. Mylapore Muhammadaul Girls' School:-

Please see S. O. No. 31 Sdl. D 17-12 and
S. O. 972 Sdl. D 23. 10. 13 which show
that the staff for this school, which stood
at 1(15), 1(12), 1(10) and 1 Peon on Rs 5, was
in Jan. 1912 raised to 1(30), 1(20), 1(15), 2(12)
and 1 Peon on Rs 8. as the strength of the
school was over 100. In October 1913,
an additional teacher on Rs 40 was
sanctioned as the strength of the school
was about 126. It is now stated that out
of the existing teachers, 2 are not wanted
(and average attendance) in view of the present strength. The
existing strength of the ^{School} staff has not
been reported; but if it is such, to
warrant a reduction of the staff by
2 teachers for a whole period of 1 year,
there seems to be no reason why the
4 teachers left at Mylapore should be
given a scale of pay higher than that
ordinarily allowed in a Muhammadaul
Girls'

2. The suggestion of the Financial Dept. in para 3 of its note appears impracticable for the following reasons. Though there has been a fall in the strength of the School, there does not appear to have been any reduction in the number of standards and consequently qualified mistresses have to be retained in the school for teaching in the higher standards and seeing that their salaries were fixed at Rs 30 & Rs 40 for special reasons no reduction of them appears to be possible.
