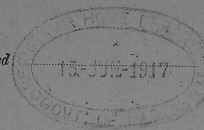

SIR,

In reply to your endorsement No. 109 B-2 dated the 23rd June 1917 referring to me for remarks the Director of Public Instruction's letter proposing to substitute the post of Assistant Sergeant for that of Head peon in the Reformatory School, Chingleput, I have the honour to state as follows:--

The Director's recommendations made on four previous occasions to treat the services of the Head peon of the Reformatory School, Chingleput, as superior were disposed of by Government in their orders Nos. 678 Ed1 dated the 10th August 1895, 408 Ed1 dated the 7th July 1896, 732 Ed1 dated the 14th December 1904 and 555 Ed1 dated the 20th May 1916. His present proposals for the substitution of the post of Assistant Sergeant for that of Head peon involve the continuance of the personnel, pay and duties of the old appointment unchanged to the

the new and in effect amount to an alteration in the designation of the appointment only, with this difference, however, that the change would mean a transfer from the inferior to superior status with increased cost to General Revenues by way of pension, leave travelling allowance and other charges.

✓ If the Director of Public Instruction's proposal is sanctioned by Government, their special orders are solicited with reference to to the Government of India ruling in their letter No.2117 C.S.R., Finance Department dated the 10th March 1912, para 3 under article 396 of the Madras Supplement to the Civil Service Regulations, correction slip No.14 dated the 6th May 1912, page 79.

My dear Cardew,

When I visited the Reformatory School with Stuart in February 1915 the head peon represented his grievances to us and Stuart considered that his request to be ^{beated} ~~beated~~ as an officer of the superior service was reasonable. I went home very soon after and the matter was overlooked till August 1916 when I addressed Government. I enclose a copy of my letter for convenience of reference. The reply I got was that "Government see no sufficient reason to reconsider their previous orders in the matter."

I mentioned this to His Excellency the other day and he advised me to apply to you. I have no fresh facts or arguments to adduce and therefore no excuse for writing again officially on the subject, but as it is likely that you have not seen the file I should be much obliged if you would be kind enough to see whether Government could not reconsider their order. I think the man ^{is} really deserving and the post

Sir,

I have the honour to request that Government will be pleased to reconsider the orders passed in G.Os. No. 678 Edl., dated 10th August 1895, No. 408 Edl., dated 7th June 1896 and No. 732 Edl., dated 14th December 1904 regarding the inclusion of the post of head peon of the Reformatory School, Chingleput, in the superior service (Vide list given in Article 396 of the Civil Service Regulations). It is reported that the present incumbent of the post a pensioned colour and pay havi^ldar who joined the appointment on the 1st June 1912 has more arduous duties to perform than any of his predecessors. His duties are (1) to supervise the boys when they are not engaged in

any work (2) to give the peons their respective watches and to drill them on Sundays and (3) to attend to the sanitary condition of the premises. Mr. Coombes states that the head of the watching staff in the other Reformatories in India is in the Superior service. I may also mention that when the Reformatory school, Chingleput, was under the control of the Jail department the incumbent of the post in question was designated head warder and as such was treated as an officer of the superior service and that the duties and responsibilities of the head peon are in no way inferior to those of the head warder in a Jail.

In view of these facts I agree with my predecessors Drs. D. Duncan and A.G. Bourne in the opinion that the post should be treated as one in the superior service.

The case referred to in the D.O. on pp.1-2 supra was dealt with in the Educational Department and was not seen by H.M.(Financial). The papers are put up below. A brief history of the case is given in the following paragraphs:-

2. In 1895, a recommendation was made by the D.P.I. for the inclusion of the head peon's post in the Reformatory School in the superior service, on the ground that the post was similar to that of a head warder in the Jail Department which was considered as belonging to the superior service. A comparative statement of the duties and responsibilities of the head peon of the Reformatory School and of a head warder was also furnished. The Government found that the duties of the two posts were not similar and rejected the proposal -vide G.O.No. 678, Edcl., dated the 10th August 1895.

3. In 1896 the proposal was again submitted to Government with a view to get the previous ^{order} reconsidered. The argument adduced for ~~the~~ reconsideration

was that the head warders in the Reformatory schools in other Presidencies in India whose duties corresponded to those of the head peon in the Reformatory school in Chingleput, were considered as belonging to the superior service and hence the corresponding post in Madras should also be classed as superior service. The Government however did not agree with the conclusion that the duties were similar and declined to reconsider the previous order on the case -vide G.O. 408 Edcl., dated the 7th July 1896.

4. In 1904 the case was submitted to Government for the third time, but in a different form. The then incumbent of the post petitioned the Government praying that he may be treated as belonging to the "superior service" or in case that was not feasible, his case may be treated as ^{special} for purpose of pension in view of his good service. Since the man was then nearly 57 years old, the Government thought that he could not justly be given the advantage of superior service then and the petition was rejected. The Hon'ble Sir George Forbes (remarked then) that "he was not convinced that the head peon of the future need be in superior service". - Vide G.O.No.732, Edcl., dated the 10th December 1904 ^{(and} page 3 of the notes ^{thereto}.

5. In March 1916 a representation was made to Government for the fourth time for a reconsideration of the previous orders. It was pointed out by the D.P.I. (page 1 - 2 of G.O.No.555, Edcl., dated the 20th May 1916) that the "present incumbent of the post, a pensioned colour and pay havildar who joined the "appointment on the 1st June 1912 had more arduous "duties to perform than any of his predecessors". The Accountant General to whom the case was referred for remarks while briefly summarising the previous history stated that the request of the Director was inadmissible.
