WHEREAS under section 3 of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (Act VII of 1904), the Kilpattur Svayambunatha temple, specifically described in the schedule annexed hereto and hereinafter referred to as 'the protected monument,' has been declared by the Government of Madras to be a protected monument under the said Act.

AND WHEREAS with a view to preserve the protected monument in its present condition the Collector of North Arcot with the previous sanction of the Madras Government conveyed in G.O. No. 3, dated 3rd January 1918, proposed to the trustees that they should enter into an agreement with the said Secretary of State for the preservation of the protected monument and the said trustees have accepted the proposal.

AND WHEREAS the terms of the said agreement so proposed and accepted are embodied in these presents.

AND WHEREAS these presents by G.O. No. 720, Home (Education), dated 6th June 1918, have been approved by the Government of Madras.

NOW THESE PRESENTS WITNESS that it is hereby mutually agreed by the trustees and the said Secretary of State as follows :—

(1) That the said Secretary of State shall have the right to maintain the protected monument in proper condition and repair and to take any measures necessary for that purpose.

(2) That the protected monument shall be under the immediate control of the trustees.

(3) (a) That the trustees shall not either themselves or through their agents or lessees or tenants destroy, remove, alter, or deface the protected monument or any part thereof.

(b) And in particular, in addition and without prejudice to the foregoing conditions that the trustees shall not without the previous consent in writing of the Collector of the district construct or give permission to construct huts or other buildings on the site within the walls of the protected monument, and shall not without such consent cultivate the said site or any part thereof.

(4) That the trustees shall render such facilities to the public or any portion of the public to have access to the protected monument and at such times and in such manner as the Collector of North Arcot for the time being shall appoint.

(5) That the trustees shall render all facilities of access to the protected monument to the Archaeological Department and such other persons deputed by the Collector of North Arcot for the time being to inspect or maintain the protected monument.

(6) That the said Secretary of State shall pay all expenses which may be incurred in connexion with the preservation and repair of the protected monument.

(7) That, in respect of the whole or any part of such expenses, the said Secretary of State shall have a charge on the protected monument and on the sale-proceeds thereof in case of its sale, to be realized only when the trustees effect sale.

(8) That, before offering the protected monument for sale either by public auction or private treaty, the trustees shall give to the Government of Madras six months' previous notice in writing of their intention to do so.

(9) That the said Secretary of State shall have the right to purchase the protected monument or such part of it as the said Secretary of State shall deem fit at its market value.

(5) That the trustees shall render all facilities of access to the protected monument to the Archaeological Department and such other persons deputed by the Collector of North Arcot for the time being to inspect or maintain the protected monument.

(6) That the said Secretary of State shall pay all expenses which may be incurred in connexion with the preservation and repair of the protected monument.

(7) That in respect of the whole or any part of such expenses the said Secretary of State shall have a charge on the protected monument and on the sale-proceeds thereof in case of its sale to be realized only when the trustees effect sale.

(8) That before offering the protected monument for sale either by public auction or private treaty, the trustees shall give to the Government of Madras six months' previous notice in writing of their intention to do so.

(9) That the said Secretary of State shall have the right to purchase the protected monument or such part of it as the said Secretary of State shall deem fit at its market value.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE
SECRETARIAT.

(a) If a paper is marked to be printed urgently, the Superintendent of the section concerned should sign the Press slip. The Superintendent should exercise a careful discretion in the matter.

(4) Each letter, memorandum, or order, or set of orders, in the file of correspondence should be headed in succession with the Roman numeral I, II, III, etc., the number being written in red ink or blue chalk above the item. The particular papers to be printed in the special issue-copies should be indicated by the Roman numeral (I, II, etc.) by which that item has been headed in the correspondence file. All matter, including marginal remarks or references, to be printed should be written in ink and matter which should not be printed should be encircled. Initials and signatures that are not quite legible should be re-written distinctly.

(b¹) For rules regarding printing of notes, see rule 315 of the office Manual.

(c) The number of copies and the details of distribution should be filled in by the Superintendent or Referencer concerned.

(d) In the absence of special instructions to the Press to keep matter standing for a specified period, ordinary papers of 8 pages and under will be kept standing for one week, and larger papers for two weeks only. The type of notes and of all confidential papers is distributed immediately after striking.

(e) This slip, properly and completely filled in, should accompany every paper sent to Press; it will be returned by the Press when proofs are furnished; it should be sent to the Press when a call is made for revised proofs or when a corrected proof is sent for striking. When finally returned by Press it should be filed with the original order or letter.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PRESS.

(a) If, in the opinion of the Superintendent of the Press, a paper has been marked urgent unnecessarily, he should send the Press slip to the Registrar with a remark to that effect.

(b) Unless a note to the contrary is made against the matter, pencil entries should not be printed. The Superintendent of the Press may bring to the notice of the Registrar any instance of incomplete or careless editing.

(c) Signature copies of letters to the Secretary of State or to the Government of India should be printed on hand-made paper.

(d) This slip should be returned by the Press to the Secretariat when proofs are furnished; it will be sent back to the Press when proofs are returned corrected and should be finally returned to the Secretariat when struck-off copies are supplied.

(e) The names of the Secretary and Members should be printed in full when they occur on the right hand side, only the first time when they appear on the left side, the initials alone being printed later.
