NOTES CONNECTED WITH RESOLUTION REGARDING
REVISED FINANCIAL STATEMENT.

[For the Meeting of the 13th March 1918.]

[SUBJECT—Construction of a school-house at Vilattikulam in the
Tinnevely district.]

The Hon'ble Mr. K. RAMA AYYANGAR :—

XVI V XLVII. This Council recommends to His Excellency the Governor in Council that a sum of Rs. 2,800 be provided for construction of a school-house at Vilattikulam in the Tinnevely district in modification of G.O. No. 1427, Home (Education), dated 14th November 1917, and that the same be provided from the grants set apart for schools in the budget of 1918-19.

HOME (EDUCATION) DEPARTMENT

V In October last the Tinnevely District Board applied for a half grant for the construction of a building for the board elementary school at Vilattikulam estimated to cost Rs. 3,800. The President then reported that the villagers had promised to contribute Rs. 1,000 and that if a half grant was sanctioned by Government, the balance would be met from the funds of the Taluk Board of the Koilpatti. For want of funds the Government were unable to comply with the request—G.O. No. 1427, Home (Education), dated the 14th November 1917.

V 2. The Director of Public Instruction has recently submitted proposals for the distribution of a subsidy of Rs. 68,995 among local boards towards the construction of elementary school buildings. In this distribution a provision of Rs. 1,900 for this school in accordance with the board's request referred to in paragraph 1 above has been included. This is likely to be approved. Even if this is not approved, it may be possible to find the amount from the lump provision of one lakh made in the next year's budget for a similar purpose as desired by the Additional Member.

W 3. A few days back the same Additional Member inquired whether any provision has been made for the Vilattikulam school. He was told in reply that the question of paying a half grant would be considered—paragraph 4 of letter No. 1426-1 L., dated 2nd March 1918. Apparently he has sent up the present resolution before the receipt of the demi-official. It is therefore likely that the Additional Member will withdraw the resolution if the position is explained to him. If however the Additional Member moves it, it may be accepted by the Government.

4. Orders are solicited as to who should be in charge of the resolution and whether it should be discussed in Council.

Extract from the Proceedings of a Meeting of the Council of the Governor at Fort St. George assembled for the purpose of making Laws and Regulations under the provisions of the Act of Parliament 5 & 6 Geo. V, Ch. 61.

The Council assembled at the Council Chamber, Fort St. George, at 11 a.m. on Wednesday the 13th day of March 1918.

RESOLUTION RE BUILDING FOR A SCHOOL AT VILATTIKULAM,
TINNEVELLY DISTRICT.

The Hon'ble Mr. K. RAMA AYYANGAR :—"Your Excellency, the resolution which I have the honour to move runs as follows :—

'XVI. This Council recommends to His Excellency the Governor in Council that a sum of Rs. 2,800 be provided for construction of a school house at Vilattikulam in the Tinnevely district in modification of G.O. No. 1427, Home (Education), dated 14th November 1917, and that the same be provided from the grants set apart for schools in the budget of 1918-1919.'

"Since sending up the resolution, I have heard, my Lord, that the provision for a half grant will be made from the funds of 1918-19. My particular request is that in addition to that, the remaining estimate for the building comes to Rs. 2,800, of which the people in the village find about Rs. 1,000, that is, the sum which will be subscribed for. The extra Rs. 900 will have to be provided from the provincial funds. I submit this is a case in which Rs. 900 may be provided so that the building of the school house may be completed as early as possible. It was a case which I had to specially place before the Government, because even the half grant could not be given. Subsequently I was informed that it could be given. The villagers have contributed Rs. 1,000 and I hope that the remaining Rs. 900 will be provided by the Government, so that this out-of-the way village may be encouraged in the extension of primary education."

The Hon'ble Mr. J. H. STONE :—"Your Excellency, the matter between the Honourable Member and myself is one of Rs. 900, it is not a matter which really affects the budget. If the extra Rs. 900 is wanted the Government will not find any difficulty in providing it, but that increase depends upon the merits of the case. If the Government think that the school deserves a contribution on its merits, the Government will find it."

His Excellency the PRESIDENT :—"It is hardly a case for the Council. The resolution may be withdrawn."

With the permission of His Excellency the President, the resolution was withdrawn.
