Honourable Sir,

I am directed to forward for the orders of His Excellency the Governor in Council an application dated the 15th May 1918 from U.Vaikunta Shanbhogue, 1st Grade Amin of the District Munsif's Court, Puttur for exemption from the provisions of Article 1 of the Public Service Notification so as to enable him to draw Rs.25, the revised scale of pay sanctioned for his post in G.O.No.749 Home (Judicial), dated the 27th March 1918.

A copy of a letter No.2217, dated the 11th June 1918 from the District Judge of South Kanara forwarding and recommending the application is also enclosed.

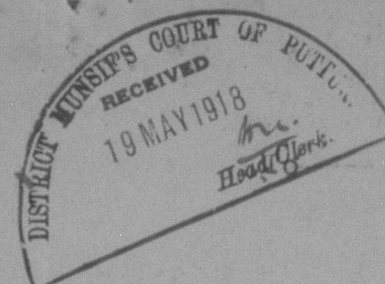

Copy of letter from the District Judge, Mangalore, to the Registrar, High Court, Madras, No.2217 dated the 11th June 1918.

I have the honour to forward herewith an application from U. Vaikunta Shanbhogue, 1st Grade Amin, District Munsif's Court, Puttur, that he may be exempted from the operation of article 1 of the Public Service Notification revised up to 15th May 1918 and published at pages 313 to 328 of Part I-B of the Fort Saint George Gazette dated 28th May 1918 to enable him to draw the increased pay at Rs.25/- sanctioned for his post in G.O.No.749 Home (Judicial) dated 27th March 1918 communicated with your R.O.C.No.348/14 dated 10th April 1918 and to state that, during the greater portion of his service, the applicant has served as an Amin. It seems unfair that the applicant should be denied the benefit of the increased salary, seeing that he has only 3 years more to serve. The exemption will also enable him to draw pension at a higher rate, and the post for which exemption is claimed is not different to the one which he now holds but only carries an increased salary. In these circumstances I request that Government may be moved to accord the necessary sanction for his exemption.

Honoured Sir,

With reference to the Itillah, Dis No. 1192 dated 30th April 1918 of the District Munsiff of Puttur regarding appointments in the Revision of the Process-Service Establishment, I most humbly and respectfully beg to --- represent the following:-

I am the holder of a 1st Grade Aminship on Rs. 20/- since 31-1-1913 and was an Amin in the II & III --- Grades from 11-7-1890. Thus, I count a service of 27 --- years in the Process-Service Establishment.

I am now 52 years old and in case I may be --- allowed the benefit of the revised pay of Rs. 25/-. I hope to retire after my 55th year on a pension of Rs. --- 12-8-0 a month.

Though an Amin, I have been entrusted with --- clerical work in the Regular Establishment during the --- greater part of my service. As regards my character, --- and abilities, I beg to append copies of testimonials ---

granted by my superiors under whom I had the good -----
fortune to serve.

I learn that his honour the District Munsiff
has been pleased to recommend me for exemption from the
Educational qualifications which I was prevented from --
acquiring on account of poverty. I may be permitted to
add that I have undergone survey-training, a qualification
prescribed by the High Court for preferential treatment
(High Court Circular No. 1667, dated 17th July 1891) --
and that at the time of the previous revision in 1889, -
the necessary exemptions from the Examination Rules were
obtained by the District Judge (District Court Circular
No. 16, dated 25-9-1889).

Under the above circumstances, I humbly pray --
that your honour may be kind enough to put me in the ---
Rs. 25/- grade as first grade Amin (a post which I hold
at present) and to recommend me for exemption from the -
Examination Rules.

For which act of kindness, I shall ever be ---
grateful.
