I have the honour, by direction of the Syndicate, to submit for the sanction of Government under section 25 (1) of the Indian Universities Act, 1904, the enclosed alterations in the Medical Regulations adopted by the Senate at its meeting held on the 7th March 1919.

The two Transitory Regulations, numbered (i) and (ii), were recommended for adoption by the Board of Studies in Medicine. The first is intended to give retrospective effect to the New Regulations for the M.B. & B.S. or L.M. & S. Degree sanctioned in G.O. No. 668, Home (Education), dated 27th May 1918 for the benefit of students of the Madras Medical College who are now candidates for the L.M. & S. Degree owing to failure to reach in some subjects of the several examinations the standard required for the M.B. & B.S. Degree, and who would have been enabled to continue as candidates for the latter degree, had the new regulations been in force when they appeared for their earlier examinations.

The second Transitory Regulation has been adopted for the benefit of Licentiates in Medicine and Surgery who graduated under the Regulations prior to April 1914, and who had a four-year course only.

The proposed alteration in the time-table for the final M.B. & B.S. or L.M. & S. Degree examination provides that not more than one of the three principal papers—Medicine, Surgery and Midwifery—shall be answered in any one day of the examination, and is intended to reduce the strain of the examination under the existing time-table.

(i) That the following Transitory Regulation be adopted :—

The revised regulations for the M.B. & B.S. and the L.M. & S. Degree sanctioned in G.O. No. 668, Home (Education), dated 27th May 1918, shall have retrospective effect—

(a) for the benefit of candidates for a degree in Medicine who during the year 1917-18 were engaged in the study of Medicine in a college affiliated to this University, and

(b) until and including the examination held in April 1924 for the benefit of candidates who have taken or have qualified for the Degree of Licentiate in Medicine and Surgery and who passed the third M.B. & B.S. or the third M.B. & C.M. Degree examination under preceding regulations.

They shall be exempted as candidates for the M.B. & B.S. Degree from re-examination in any subject or subjects in which they have at any time gained total marks qualifying for such exemptions under the revised regulations.

**Resolutions adopted by the Senate at its meeting
held on March 7, 1919**

(i) That the following Transitory Regulation be adopted:—

The revised Regulations for the M.B. & B.S. and the L.M. & S. Degree sanctioned in G.O. No. 668, Home (Education), dated May 27, 1918, shall have retrospective effect—

(a) for the benefit of candidates for a degree in Medicine who during the year 1917-1918 were engaged in the study of Medicine in a college affiliated to this University,
and

(b) until and including the examination held in April 1924 for the benefit of candidates who have taken or have qualified for the Degree of Licentiate in Medicine and Surgery and who passed the Third M.B. & B.S. or the Third M.B. & C.M. Degree Examination under preceding Regulations.

They shall be exempted as candidates for the M.B. & B.S. Degree from re-examination in any subject or subjects in which they have at any time gained total marks qualifying for such exemptions under the revised Regulations.

(ii) That the following Transitory Regulation be adopted for the benefit of L.M. & S. graduates (old) who had a four years course only:—

A Licentiate in Medicine and Surgery who graduated under the Regulations prior to April 1914 shall be permitted to appear for the M.D. or M.S. Degree Examination subject to the following provisions:—

(1) that the candidate produces satisfactory evidence of having been regularly engaged in the practice of Medicine for a period of not less than seven years subsequent to obtaining the L.M. & S. Degree.

(2) that the candidate produces satisfactory evidence of having taken an approved course or courses or of having held a Medical or Surgical appointment at one or more of the hospitals attached to a College of Medicine affiliated to this University for a period of not less than one year immediately preceding the date on which he applies to be admitted to the examination for the M.D. or M.S. Degree.

(3) that the candidate produces testimonials from two Doctors of Medicine, or two Masters of Surgery or two Fellows of the University, certifying that he is in habits and character a fit and proper person to receive the degree.

(4) that the candidate produces a certificate signed by the President of the Faculty of Medicine and by the Medical Officer in charge of the Hospital in which he has taken the course or courses or at which he has held an appointment as approved in para 2 above that the work in which he has been specially engaged in the said hospital is a suitable preparation for the particular branch or subjects of the M.D. or M.S. Degree Examination respectively for which he selects to appear.

(iii) That the following alteration be made in the Regulations:—

That the time-tables for the Final M.B. & B.S. or L.M. & S. Degree Examination in Chapter XXXI of the revised Regulations be altered as follows:—

First day	{ 10-1 Medicine, etc. (Part II)

Second day	{ 10-1 Surgery, etc. (Part II)
