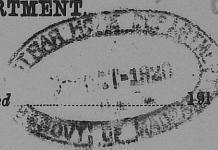

Sir,

I have the honour to address Government on the question of sanctioning a grant towards the rent of the Catholic Young Women's Home, Egmore, which was opened in August 1919.

2. The Correspondent applies for a rent-grant as the hostel is primarily intended for students attending the Presidency Training School for Mistresses, Egmore, and other educational institutions in Madras. The hostel is capable of accommodating 12 boarders and of those now in residence are engaged either in educational or medical work.

5. As there is at present a great scarcity of suitable hostels in Madras, I consider that it is very advisable to encourage the opening of more hostels for women teachers and students by giving a Grant-in-Aid towards the rent and equipment of such hostels. It is desirable that the young women teachers in the Government schools as well as the students attending training and Medical Schools who do not live with their parents or relations in Madras should live in hostels where they will have proper care and suitable companionship without being exposed to the dangers and temptations of city life. The Matron of the Catholic Young Women's Hostel is a retired Government teacher who had an excellent record during her term of service under Government. The Archbishop of Madras, The Most Rev. Dr. J. Aelen, has made himself responsible for the rent of the hostel, but he states that without a Grant-in-Aid ^{he} will not be able to carry it on much longer as the rent of the bungalow is Rs. 125 per mensem. It is centrally situated in Harris Road, Egmore, and is easily accessible to the students under training in the Presidency Training School and the Anglo-Indian teachers employed in the Government Training Schools, Royapettah and ~~the~~ Triplicane. The hostel is non-sectarian and admits students and teachers of all denominations.

The Correspondent states that no monthly rent has been levied from the residents but that during holidays a reservation fee at the rate of Rs. 5 per boarder has been charged. I consider that for the purpose of grant under Chapter V A, of the Grant-in-Aid Code a sum of Rs. 2 may be fixed as the monthly rent due from each boarder, and I accordingly request that you will be so good as to obtain the approval of Government to this rate.

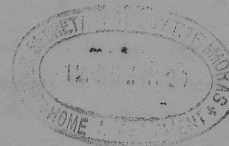

Or if it be the D.P.I.'s idea that the net rent should be theoretically shared by a rate for boarder for all boarders, there is the question how the D.P.I. proposes to limit his aid only to the extent that the institution benefits students.

It would be reasonable to require a higher rent from teachers. It may be Rs 2 for a student & Rs 10 for a teacher. The reservation fee is not a permanent fee and not, I think, be taken

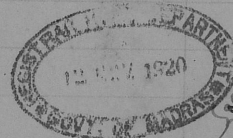

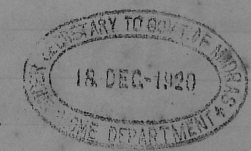
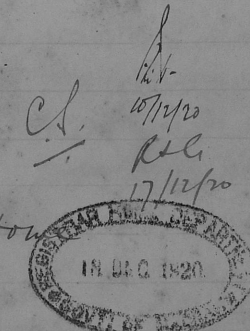
