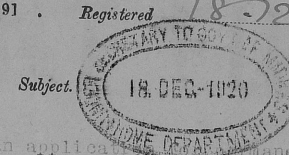

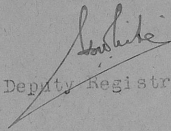

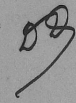

from the District Judge, Trichinopoly, to the Registrar,
High Court, Madras.

In forwarding herewith the application of K.
Krishna Ayyah, 6th clerk and Shorthand writer of the Sub-
ordinate Judge's Court, Trichinopoly, for exemption from
the Examination Rules for holding appointments on salaries
up to Rs.50, I have the honour to state that in recommending
the exemption, the Subordinate Judge remarks:--"I find the
clerk quick in his work and satisfactory. He writes a
neat and good hand".

2. The applicant entered service as a Reader in
the Copyist Establishment in the District Court in the year
1911 and was confirmed as a clerk on Rs.20 in the Sub-Court
on 18th July 1912. He has been a Shorthand Writer of that
court from 28th November 1916 and his services as such
have been appreciated by 3 Subordinate Judges (vide copies
of testimonials attached with the application)

3. The applicant has passed the Lower Secondary
Examination and studied up to Matriculation class and he
was exempted from the Examination Rules by the Commissioner
of Government Technical Examinations to appear for Short-
hand and Type-writing in the Intermediate Grade and has
passed these examinations. The applicant's service
amounts to more than 9 years.

4. In the above circumstances I have the honour
to request that the High Court may be pleased to obtain
from the Government the necessary exemption for the appli-
cant for holding appointments on salaries up to Rs.40/-.

I respectfully beg to submit the following
for your honour's gracious consideration and favourable orders.

I entered service as a Reader in the Copyist
Establishment of the District Court on the 3rd August 1911.
I was then taken to the Subordinate Judge's Court, Trichinopoly,
to act as Typist for a short period (1-7-1912 to 17-7-1912)
during the absence of the permanent incumbent on privilege
leave and subsequently confirmed as a clerk on Rs 20/- in the
same Court on 18-7-1912 when your honour presided over this
Court. I am also the shorthand writer of this Court from
28 - 11 - 1916. From the year 1911 up to date so many -
chances of promotion have occurred , not to speak of the -
" Phillips Scheme" and my claims for the same have been invaria-
-bly overlooked and clerks who were many years my juniors got
promotions for the sole reason that I did not happen to possess
the minimum general educational qualification.

During all this interval, however, I was -
entrusted by successive Subordinate Judges with multifarious
duties of a very responsible and confidential nature out of
all proportion to my salary and I was not found wanting either
in capacity or in trust. This fact will be borne out by the
testimonies of officers under whom I had the honour of serving

and among whom I may mention Messrs. A.S. Balasubramani Ayyar
Avl, late District Judge of this place; R.A. Krishnaswami -
Ayyar Avl, your honour's predecessor and your honour's good
self.

I have passed the Lower Secondary Examination
and studied up to the Matriculation class. I was, however,
exempted from the examination rules by the Commissioner for
Government Technical Examinations to appear for Shorthand &
Typewriting, Intermediate grade and have passed the same.

In the above circumstances I pray most respect-
fully that your honour will be pleased to recommend me to the
High Court to address the Government to obtain Permanent -
Exemption from the Examination Rules for holding appointments
on salaries up to Rs 50 /-
