Judge, Madura, recommending the permanent exemption
from the Examination Rules of nine individuals employed
in the civil courts in his district, so as to enable
them to hold appointments carrying salaries of Rs. 50/-
and Rs. 35/- per mensem.

Copy of letter from the District Judge, Madura, No.7045, dated the 15th November 1920, to the Registrar, High Court, Madras.

I have the honour to recommend the following individuals for the concession contemplated in paragraph 3 of article 1 of the Public Service Notification, published in the Fort St. George Gazette, dated the 28th April 1919, Part I-B from page 281. All of them are natives of India who have not attended any Secondary School, but have undergone the old Matriculation course.

8 years (1)

1. D.J.Arumsinayagam, 7th clerk, District Court on Rs.20/-. He entered Government service in 1912. He completed his Matriculation course and actually appeared for the examination in 1907. His results were not published for want of a school attendance certificate. He has been doing his duties quite satisfactorily. I recommend him for exemption from examination rules in respect of appointments carrying salaries up to Rs.50/- per mensem.

2. S.Nagalingam Pillai, 6th clerk, District Munsif's Court of Periyakulam on Rs.20/-. He has put in a service of 10 years in the Department. He has passed the Lower Secondary Examination and appeared for the Matriculation Examination during 1904 to 1906 but failed. But the Officer under whom he was serving in August 1920 states that he has been doing his work very well and as the Record-keeper of the Court has kept the records in a very satisfactory state. The applicant is recommended for exemption from examination rules for appointments carrying salary up to Rs.50/- per mensem.

3. S.A.Sundaram Ayyar, 8th clerk, Subordinate Judge's Court of Dindigul on Rs.20/-. He entered the Judicial Department as a Copyist in June 1912 and was drafted into the Regular Establishment as a clerk on 1-10-1913. From that date he has

been working as the Original Side bench clerk. He appeared for the Matriculation Examination twice in the years 1908 and 1909 without success. One Sub Judge and three District Munsifs speak very well of his work and character and he has been the Original side bench clerk for the last 7 years. Mr. T.G.Ramaswami Ayyar, Subordinate Judge of Dindigul, under whom he is now serving, in forwarding his application states, "The clerk is doing original trial work in this court and his knowledge of English is more than that of a School Final Candidate. He is an efficient clerk." Mr. V. Daniel Chellappa Pillai, now District Munsif of Tinnevely has certified in July 1919 that he was the best Bench Clerk he had come across. I therefore recommend him for exemption from examination rules in respect of appointments carrying salaries up to Rs.50/- per mensem.

4. David Samuel Pillai, permanent 6th clerk of the District Munsif's Court of Madura Town on Rs.25/- and sub-protem Assistant Nazir, District Court, Madura on the same pay. He has put in a total service of 19 years in the Judicial Department. He is acquainted with all branches of work on the Regular and the Nazarat side. Mr. N. Sundaram Ayyar formerly the Principal District Munsif of Madura and now Small Causes Court Judge, Kumbakonam has certified as follows in March 1919:- "D.Samuel Pillai has been doing the heavy small cause work of this Court for the past 24 years to my entire satisfaction. He is a thoroughly honest and efficient and hardworking clerk. Though he is an unpassed man he has studied up to the Matriculation Examination and has a good knowledge of English. He richly deserves exemption to enable him to get promotion". He has been doing his present duties to my satisfaction. My predecessor Mr. L.G.Moore recommended him for exemption to hold posts the pay of which does not exceed Rs.35/- per mensem and it was sanctioned by the Government in letter No. 365 dated 24--3--1920 which was communicated by the High Court in its Order Dis.No.843 of 1920, dated 30-3-1920 and I now recommend him for exemption from examination rules in respect of appointments carrying salaries up to Rs.50/- per mensem.

(5) 5. T. Soundararaja Ayyangar, Typist, District Court, on Rs. 31/- . He has studied up to the Matriculation Class. . He has passed Typewriting (Advanced grade) Shorthand, Book-keeping Correspondence, Banking and Drawing (Elementary grade). He has been doing his duties quite satisfactorily. He is recommended for exemption from examination rules for appointments carrying salary up to Rs. 50/- per mensem.

(6) 6. D.S. Chinniah Raja, 2nd grade Amin, District Munsif's Court of Periyakulam on Rs. 20/- . He belongs to the Candiyan Royal family, being the great grandson of Prince Angalaswami Raja, the brother-in-law of Keerthisinhala Maharaja of Candy. He has put in a service of more than 10 years in this Department and his work is said by the District Munsif to be satisfactory. He is recommended for exemption from examination rules for posts carrying salary up to Rs. 50/- per mensem.

(7) 7. M. Gangadara Ayyar, 8th clerk District Munsif's Court of Madura Taluk on Rs. 20/- . He has studied up to the Matriculation standard and has passed in Typewriting (Advanced grade) Book-keeping (Intermediate) Shorthand and Theory and Practice of Commerce (Elementary grade). The District Munsif under whom he is now serving says "The applicant is diligent and hard-working". He is recommended for exemption from examination rules for appointments carrying salary up to Rs. 35/- per mensem.

(8) 8. A.G. Ponniah Thevar, Permanent Reader, District Court on Rs. 15/- . He has studied up to the Matriculation Standard and gone also through the Secondary School Leaving Certificate course. He has been working in this Court for the last 3 years. He has been doing his duties satisfactorily. He is a Marava, a backward class by caste. He is recommended for exemption from the examination rules for appointments carrying a salary up to Rs. 35/- per mensem.

(9) 9. S. Sundararajulu Naidu, 2nd grade Amin, Sub Court, Dindigul on Rs. 20/- . He has passed the Lower Secondary Examination and the Survey training in the First Class. He entered this Department in May 1900. He has acted as clerk and 1st grade Amin on many occasions. The officer under whom he has served states "Though he is a permanent Amin of this Court he was all along doing clerical

work and on several occasions appointed to act as a clerk and 1st grade Amin under temporary exemptions from 1907. He knows office work of the Regular and the Nazarat Establishments". I recommend him for exemption from examination rules for appointments carrying salary up to Rs. 35/- per mensem.

Considering the length of service and the efficiency of the above persons, I request that the High Court will be pleased to recommend and obtain orders declaring them eligible for appointments carrying salaries noted against each individual.

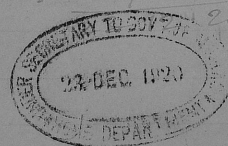

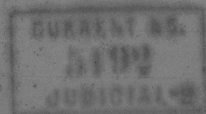
