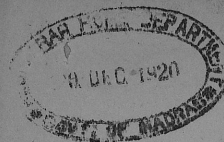

I am directed to invite a reference to the correspondence ending with your letter No.522, dated the 29th April 1920, and say that His Honour Sir Reginal Craddock will be glad if, with the permission of His Excellency the Governor in Council, this Government could be supplied with fifteen copies of the Madras Children Act, 1920, as^{finally} passed by the Madras Legislative Council.

2. I am further to request that this Government may be furnished with ~~the~~ information as to whether there are Juvenile Courts elsewhere than at the headquarters of each district and, if not, whether youthful offenders are sent to headquarters for trial.
