The humble memorial of S. Bhujanga Rao, typist, Law Secretariat.

Most Honoured Sir,

The memorialist was a clerk in the Kurnool Collectorate prior to his joining the Secretariat as a typist and was working under the late Mr. B.H. Barlow Poole, District Forest Officer and his successors as a clerk. He has been tried in every branch of the Collectorate. The extract of the letter from the Collector of Kurnool E. S. Lloyd Esquire, I.C.S., to the Board of Revenue herein enclosed might be perused as to how he has working under those officers there. The memorialist begs to submit that in spite of the malarial nature of the places he was working to the entire satisfaction of his superiors. He has put in nearly 13 years permanent service and out of which he has served in the malarial districts for about 10 years. He was subjected to every sort of hard work when accompanying the officers on tour especially in malarial tracts of the Kurnool district. He adds further that he had about a year's service in the Public Works Department, Bellary district and the endorsement of the Executive Engineer on his application to the Secretariat might be perused which will show his work in that department.

Ever since he entered service he was working as a clerk and only after joining the Secretariat he has been doing the duties of a typist.

The memorialist now begs to approach the Secretary with the request that he may be permanently exempted from article I of the Public Service Notification with a view to better his prospects.

He has had no opportunity of doing clerical work in this office. Mr. Lloyd's certificate given eight years ago (page 2 of c.f) testifies to Bhujanga Rao's capacity for clerical work. There are now among the 13 ^{*}lower division clerks and typists of this office four persons exempted from the general educational qualifications (two out of four among the typists alone). The exemption if granted will not enable Bhujanga Rao to draw any higher pay as under the recent decision old typists are also to be given new scale of pay. This will however enable him to appear for special tests, which he desires to, and to qualify for clerical posts in the mufassal.
