Sir

In partial modification of the recommendations made in Director's Letter R.C.No. 496/81 dated 29th March 1921, for the immediate introduction of Science teaching in the Queen Mary's College, I have the honour to request that Government may be pleased to sanction the employment temporarily for a period of one year from the 1st July, 1921, of an additional Assistant Professor in the Presidency College for imparting instruction in Chemistry to the students

students of the Queen Mary's College who attend the former institution for groups i and ii of the Intermediate course.

2. Since submitting the recommendations mentioned above, I have attended a meeting of the Syndicate of the University of Madras and discussed the provision to be made for the teaching of Science with the Professor of Physics of the Presidency College and I am now in a position to state that any temporary provision that might be made at the Queen Mary's College for instruction in Science would be unsatisfactory and in all probability unacceptable to the University authorities. I therefore recommend that the question of providing for instruction in Science at the Queen Mary's College as detailed in the letter of the

Director No. 476 dated 29th March 1921 may be deferred for the present and that during the ensuing academic year the women students may as heretofore continue to attend the Presidency college for instruction in Science.

3. The Principal and the Professor of Chemistry of the Presidency College report that if the women students continue to attend the Presidency College for instruction in Science, an additional Assistant Professor should be appointed to look after their chemistry work, as owing to the rapid increase in the number of women students taking up groups i and ii, it is not possible for one Assistant

Professor to look after both the Physics and Chemistry work.

The number of women students taking up groups i and ii was 40 in 1920-21 and a further increase is expected next term.

I therefore recommend that another Assistant Professor in addition to the one sanctioned in G.O.No. 828 Educational, M.S., dated 3rd August 1915, and continued for another year from

from 1st April 1921 in G.O.No. 391 Home (Education) dated 16th March 1921, may be sanctioned in the last grade of the Subordinate Educational Service (Collegiate Branch) for a period of one year from 1st July 1921.

4. The sanctioned strength of the Subordinate Educational Service (Collegiate branch) is as detailed hereunder:-

5. The additional expenditure of Rs.1000 viz. Rs.100 plus temporary addition to pay Rs.25) during the current year can come out of the savings accruing from the provision made for the salaries of the Science Professor sanctioned for the College in G.O.No.1239 Home (Education) dated 24th October 1919.
