Sir,

The President of the Home Missionary Society of India, Calcutta, has applied for a grant towards the cost of the purchase of property known as "Mountain Home" in Coonoor in which their school The Home Missionary Society's Children's Home is located. It will be seen from the copy of his letter dated 14th June 1920 submitted herewith that the property has already been purchased. The Inspector of European Schools, reports that the school is doing useful work, and that it is needed for the present, as the other poor schools in Coonoor are Roman Catholic schools and that the school might perhaps be ultimately absorbed by St. Georges Homes, Keti. As the school is reported to be needed for the present, I think all

that is necessary now is to give a grant towards the cost of the purchase of the building referred to to enable the management to clear off the debt which it is reported amounts to Rs.6,000/- I have the honour accordingly to recommend that under article 50(C) of the Code of Regulations for European Schools, a grant of Rs.6000 be sanctioned, payable, when funds are available on submission of the sale deed etc., and after the execution of the trust deed required under Article 56 of the Code of Regulations for European schools..

2. If the grant recommended above is sanctioned, I propose to inform the Society, if Government see ~~no objection~~ ^{no objection} that only sufficient ^{fund} has been given to get the school out of debt, and to ask the managers whether they would not agree to sell their properties and cooperate with the St. Georges Homes on suitable terms after their removal to the Nilgiris.

Letter from the President, Home Missionary Society of India, Calcutte, dated 14th June 1920.

I have the honour to apply to you for financial assistance in the purchase of the property known as Mountain Home, Coonoor, in which is located the school of this society for the rescue and education of children of indigent parents of the domiciled European and Anglo-Indian Community.

Perhaps I should explain how a society Head quartered at Calcutta should be interested in an institution about 1500 miles away. The explanation is simple--the Society was inaugurated in Southern India with a local management committee, but having Auxiliaries all over India, the management for the last 5 years has come to these parts but may at any time go back to southern India.

We had hopes of a subsidy towards the purchase of the property from the European Schools Improvement Association and as late as last February only were told by that body that no grants were to be made this year. *on 14.1.21 - appax A at 11.9.20. 622 Rev. B.*

Then again owing to the Indian chief, viz, the Rajah of Kalikote and Atagada, who is heir to the estate, coming of age shortly and being told of the probability of his retaining the property for his own use-a fact which would have broken up our school- the purchase was literally rushed and in order to pay the requisite amount into the Bank of Madras we have had to raise a loan of Rs.3,000/- and utilise ear-marked funds of our society to the extent of nearly Rs.5,000/- leaving us with a debt of Rs.8,000/- We are anxious to adjust our accounts hence we approach you under the provisions of Section X Building Grants pages 11 and 122 of the Madras Government Code of Regulations for European Schools.

My Society is quite prepared to abide by the conditions imposed by the code and an application I understand is being made by our local school Principal through the Government ~~of~~ Inspector of -- schools whose reports will testify to the efficiency of our school and a guarantee of maintenance. I can vouch for on the grounds that from a very little beginning of just 15 years ago we have grown to our present status, having acquired property to the extent of:-

In his official report and, we earnestly hope, his recommendation, the Inspector of Schools will doubtless submit details to you. But all I respectfully submit is that having met this huge payment our resources have been reduced to one of hand to mouth, and if you will be pleased to assist my Society with a moiety viz, Rs. 15,000/- of the purchase money viz, Rs. 26,000/- of the property known as Mountain Home, Coonoor, our gratitude shall know no bounds and a deserving institution shall receive assistance and be set on a proper financial footing.

I enclose for your ~~perusal~~ perusal copy of a pictorial booklet we have recently issued as a means of enlisting public sympathy.

Begging again that you will give our petition your kindest consideration and asking an acknowledgement pending your final -- reply.

Subject Home Missionary Society's
Children Home Building Grant
[C no 450B] from the D.P.D. no 6254 of 7.2.21

The Home Missionary Society's Children Home, is a middle school for girls (European & Eurasians) with 51 pupils on the rolls on the 31st March 1919. The institution has got into debts incurred by the purchase of the property known as 'Mountain House' in which the school is located. The D.P.D. proposes to give a grant of Rs. 6,000 to get the school out of debt. The proposal is admissible under article 50(c) of the Code of Regulations for European schools and may be sanctioned.

2. In para 2 mp 2 of the D.P.D. appearing proposes concentration of schools with reference to clause (5) of G.O. no 876d, 2.7.17. If as a result of this, the property "Mountain House" is found not to be required for school purposes the Govt will under article 60 of the Code have a prior lien on the building for the recovery of the grant now proposed. A provision to this effect will be made in the trust deed which the mission will be required to execute before the grant is disbursed. (Vide the foregoing the dec on

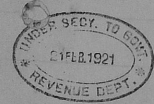

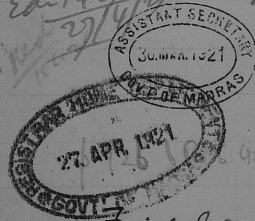
