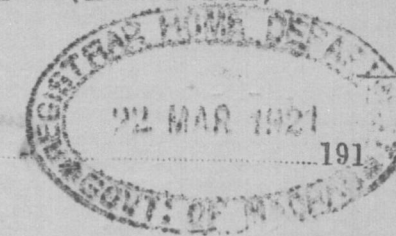

Sir,

I have the honour to state that in G.O.No.1255 Home (Education) dated 20-9-18 Government sanctioned the - Director's proposal to permit the authorities of the Presidency College, Madras to take a life membership of the India Society, London at a cost of £.12-12-0. The amount was accordingly remitted to Mr. Blackwell, Oxford, in November 1918 who however while acknowledging the receipt of the draft stated in his letter dated 1-3-19 (copy enclosed) that it was considered impossible to admit the College to a life membership and that the amount of the draft would be credited to the general account of the college, pending instructions.

2 As he had to be paid £.2-2-0 being the cost of the Society's publications for the years 1916^{and} 1917, it was thought that the above amount might be deducted from £.12-12-0 referred to supra. There still remains £.10-10-0 with Mr. Blackwell and the society has now - called for the subscriptions £.3-3-0 for the years, 1918, 19^{and} 1920 on the understanding that the college continues on the list of subscribers.

M 3. As it is desirable that the college should be supplied with the society's publications I request you will be so good as to obtain the sanction of Government for permitting the college to become an annual subscriber to the society on payment of a subscription of £.1-1-0. If this proposal be sanctioned the amount of £.10-10-0 with Mr. Blackwell may be utilised to cover the annual subscriptions which cover the years 1918-1927 inclusive.

Copy of letter from Mr. B.H. Blackwell, Oxford, Ref. M.W/884 dated 1st March 1919.

I duly received yours of the 21st November, No. 459/16, together with draft £.12-12-0, and have since been in communication with the Secretary of the India Society, who (after some delay) writes as follows: 'I am afraid my previous answer to your question, as to whether the - Presidency College, Madras, could take up a life Membership in this Society was made without due consideration and cannot be confirmed. Life Memberships must evidently be ^{confirmed} ~~confirmed~~ to terminable lives, and the college, I hope is immortal'. Under these circumstances I have for the present carried the amount of the draft to credit in your general account, pending instructions to the contrary, when you will no doubt let me know whether you have as yet received -- any publications from the Society. Also whether you would like me to pay an annual subscription to it, and if so ~~from~~ from what period you would like the supply of these publications to begin. In the meantime I enclose stamped receipt for the amount received.
