In their order No.735 Educational, dated the 26th August 1912, the Government sanctioned the proposal for the opening of a hostel for Brahman widows with the main object of enabling young widows to take up the teaching profession in order to meet the growing demand for caste women teachers. In 1913 it was reported that nine widows of ages varying from 11 to 21 years had till then joined the hostel and that in spite of their having had some education in their respective vernaculars, they were entirely ignorant of English ^{and} most of them had to be admitted into the infant class of the secondary school attached to the Training School for mistresses. As it would take many years before they could complete the secondary school and training courses and become eligible for work as headmistresses in girls' schools, it was suggested that with a view to curtail the period of their education the older widows in particular be taught privately in the hostel until such time as they could qualify for admission into some of the higher classes. The Govt. therefore sanctioned in 1913 the employment for a period of six months in the first instance of two teachers on Rs.20 each per mensem for imparting private tuition to the widows - G.O.No.204, dated 5-3-13. The pay was subsequently raised to Rs.25 per mensem.

2. The continuance of the employment of these two teachers was sanctioned from time to time till 1915, when the Director reported that no capable teachers were available to undertake the work for a salary of Rs.25 per mensem and he therefore proposed to employ one secondary grade teacher on Rs.50 per mensem who was to spend four hours a day in the

The Government ^{thereupon} sanctioned a temporary establishment
at cost of not more than ~~that~~ Rs.50 per mensem
for the purpose. G.O.No.1266, dated 23-11-15.

3. This arrangement continued till 1920 and the teacher was giving instruction to the members of both ^(u)the widows' home and ^(u)the non-Brahman caste Hindu hostel - vide page 1 of G.O.No.651, dated 2-6-20. In April 1920 the D.P.I. reported that the strength of the class in the early years ranged from about ^{that} 6 to 10, ~~but~~ it was then possible for a part time ~~N~~ tutor on Rs.50 per mensem to give individual attention to the pupils and that the strength of widows requiring such instruction had steadily risen in subsequent ~~years~~ till it stood at 19 in the year 1919 which made individual tuition by a part-time ~~teacher~~ tutor impossible. The D.P.I. therefore proposed to employ a full time teacher of the secondary grade to enable her to take the widows in batches and make them fit for admission into the required standard in one year by giving them individual attention. The Government thereupon sanctioned the employment from 1st June 1920 of a full time teacher at a cost not exceeding Rs.100 per mensem ^(vide) G.O.No. 651, dated 2-6-20. Being a full time appointment she will also be eligible for temporary addition to pay and there is therefore a provision of Rs.125 x 12 or ^{Rs} 1,500 in the budget.

4. For orders whether the resolution may be opposed and as to who will take charge of it, whether further information is required and whether the resolution will be discussed at the Cabinet meeting.

The employment of the private tutor is special and is purposely designed to suit the conditions prevailing in the two hostels. Castleknock teachers are needed & suitable material is not immediately forthcoming. New recruits had to be rendered fit for joining higher classes. The arrangement of a private tutor is calculated to secure economy. But for this, a large amount will have to be spent in paying scholarships from the lower classes & there will be a waste in time.

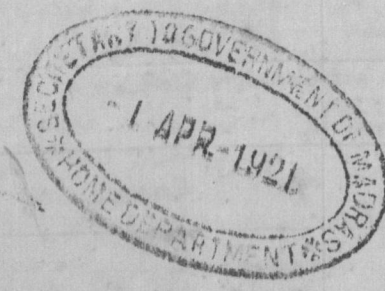

Extract from the proceedings of the Leg. Council

The next motion standing in the name of Mr. C. NATESA MUDALIYAR was as follows :—

27 That under 31-D (b). Education—Special, the provision for one temporary teacher, Students' Hostel, of Rs. 1,500 be omitted (Budget page 134).

In moving the motion he said :—“ I request the Government for information as to the hostel to which this teacher is attached. If it is only for a particular hostel, may I request the Government to extend this help to other hostels? If the Government assures me, I have no objection to withdraw my proposition.”

Mr. A. RAMASWAMI MUDALIYAR :—“ The provision of Rs. 1,500 for one temporary teacher, at the Students' Hostel, is to coach students of all communities who are deficient in the English language just as we do in the Vizagapatam High School. The provision is not meant for any particular community, and at present the temporary teacher teaches nine Brahmans, eight non-Brahmans and one Indian Christian girl student.”

The motion was by leave withdrawn.

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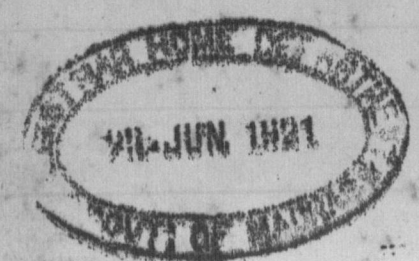
