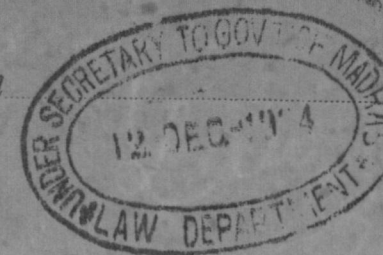

May it please your Lordship,

I respectfully beg to submit the following for --
your Lordship's kind consideration and favour of orders.

2. I was appointed to the Indian Educational Service
on 14th May 1919, that is prior to 1st December 1919. (Vide
Port St. George Gazette dated 27--7--1919 No. 133; page 515
on a scale of Rs. 500-50-1000.)

3. In G.O. No. 753 Law (Education) dated 1-6-1923 the
Government of Madras stated that the Government of India
declined to sanction my exemption from the operation of the
rest at the stage of Rs. 600 in the time-scale of pay ---
sanctioned for the members of the Indian Educational Service.
But that under article 228 of the Civil Account Code Vol.1
the Government were pleased to waive the excess pay drawn--

by me from 14th May 1922 to 30th April 1923. Accordingly, the Accountant General, Madras in his letter No. G.A.69-153 dated 11--6--1923 asked me to refund the excess pay of Rs.21 drawn by me at Rs. 50 per mensem from May 1st 1923 to 13th May 1923, and I was allowed to draw pay at Rs. 650 per --- mensem from 14th May 1923 to 13th May 1924 and at Rs. 700 per mensem from 14th May 1924.

4. In G.O. No. 1313 Law (Education) dated 13th May 1924, the Government of Madras stated that the Secretary of State for India in Council had decided to exempt from the pause in the Indian Educational Service time-scale at Rs. 600 per mensem, all officers who were appointed to that service prior to December^{1st} 1919. But the Government of --- India ordered that the revised orders were to have effect from 26th May 1924 only, the date of their receipt by the Government of India. Accordingly I was allowed to draw-- Rs. 750 per mensem from 26--5--1924.

5. I beg to submit that as the Secretary of State for India in Council decided to exempt me from the pause in the Indian Educational Service time-scale at Rs. 600 per mensem, I ought to have drawn my annual increments -- regularly from the date of my appointment to that service, that is from 14th May 1919.

But on account of the orders of the Government of India quoted in paragraphs 3 and 4 above I drew

Rs. 600 per mensem from 1st May 1923 to 13th May 1923 instead of Rs. 650 per mensem as originally sanctioned in my agreement with the Secretary of State for India.

Rs. 650 per mensem from 14th May 1923 to 13th May 1924 instead of Rs. 700 per mensem.

and Rs. 700 per mensem from 14th May 1924 to 25th May 1924 instead of Rs. 750 per mensem.

Thus I have lost Rs. 641(21+600+20) pay on account of the Government of India stating that the revised orders of the Secretary of State for India in Council should have effect from 26th May 1924 only, instead of with retrospective effect from 1st May 1923.

6. In these circumstances I respectfully pray that --- the revised orders to exempt me from the pause at Rs. 600 in the Indian Educational Service Time-scale be ordered to -- come into force with complete retrospective effect from --- 1st May 1923.

7. For this act of kindness I shall be every grateful to your Lordship.

In para 2 of letter no. 1434, D.H. 10.10.23
the Government recommended the
exemption from the pause at Rs 600
of Messrs Krishnamma, Sankaran & Ananda
Doo. The Secretary of State sanctioned
their exemption, but the order was
given effect only from the 26th May
1924, the date of the receipt of the
Secretary of State's despatch by the
Government of India. Apparently
the Secretary of State did not
specifically direct that his orders
should have retrospective effect.

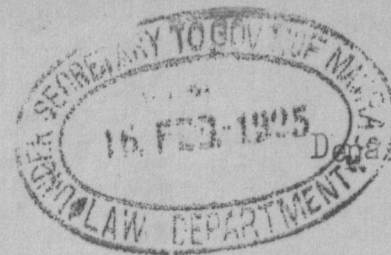
