Sir,

In continuation of my letter R.O.C.No.460 E/24 dated 22-9-24 and with reference to para 2 of G.O.No. Misc.1588, Law(Education) dated 14-10-24 regarding the Lovedale Training School, I have the honour to state that the Superintendent of the school(Mr.Padfield) advises that the Training School be continued on a permanent basis, the only changes suggested being that admissions should be made every year instead of every alternate year as at present and that admissions be restricted to Middle grade candidates alone instead of to Middle and Primary grade candidates as at present

He also desires that the same financial aid be given to the school from provincial funds as at present.

2. The Inspector of European Schools accepts the Superintendents' suggestions that admission should be made every year instead of every alternate year and that they should be restricted to candidates for Middle grade certificates. He prefers, however, that the school should be treated as an aided school and maintained from the funds which are now held in trust by the trustees of the Lawrence Memorial School and from Government grants. He informs me, however, that the trustees are not prepared at present to accept the responsibility of maintaining the school as he would prefer, and that they are doubtful whether their funds will suffice to maintain the school according to departmental standards or according to the standard which they place before themselves.

3. I would advise that the suggestions regarding the restriction of admissions to candidates for Middle grade certificates and regarding yearly admissions be accepted, and that the Training School be continued with the present financial arrangements for a further period of two years, at the end of which time the financial arrangements be reconsidered with a view to placing the school, if possible, under the entire control of the Lawrence Memorial School authorities and treating it as an aided school subject to the ordinary grants-in-aid rules of the Code of Regulations for European Schools.

(cf) (G.No.3388-B) From the D.P.I.No.460-E/24 dated 3rd December 1924.

In G.O.No.167, Law(Edn), dated 29-1-23, the Govt.sanctioned the opening of an aided training school for European and Anglo-Indian women at Lovedale under the control of the committee of the Lawrence Memorial School, as a temporary measure, for a period of two years in the first instance. The G.O.also laid down the items and amounts of expenditure to be incurred on the school. As regards grants from provincial funds, the Govt.sanctioned a special grant of Rs.4,756 a year towards the expenditure of the school, and, in addition, directed that the expenditure on account of travelling allowance (to be limited to Rs.240 per annum) and stipends at the ordinary rates be met from provincial funds. The Govt. decided to appoint Miss Blake, a Govt. Officer, as Mistress of Method in the Training school and to meet her pay from provincial funds. On account of this arrangement, the special grant of Rs.4,756 payable to the school ^(which was intended also to cover the pay of the Mistress) was to be reduced by Rs.200 a month for the period during which Miss Blake ^{did} duty ~~in the school~~ in the school.

2. From the report on the school recorded in G.O.No.1588, dated 14-11-24, it will be seen that the school was actually opened on the 1st May 1923 and that the training period for the 2nd year ends on 31st. December 1924. As required in paragraph 8 of G.O. No.167, dated 29-1-23, the Director has now submitted a report on the

question of the further continuance of the school. After consulting Mr. Padfield, the Superintendent of the Training school, and the Inspector of European schools, the Director advises that the Training school may be continued with the present financial arrangements for a further period of two years, subject to the ^{two} changes that admissions should be made every year instead of every alternate year as at present and that admissions be restricted to middle grade candidates alone instead of to middle and primary grade candidates as at present. The necessity for the further continuance of the school may be ^{admitted} ~~admitted~~; the question for consideration is whether it should be continued temporarily ~~for~~ or be made permanent. The proposal to transfer the control of the L.M. School, Lovedale, to a Board of Trustees is likely to mature soon, but it does not seem desirable to commit the ^{Board of} ~~trustees~~ to any permanent expenditure such as that on the ^{at Lovedale, before the Board is} ~~Lovedale Training school~~ actually constituted. The best course would therefore seem to be to adopt the Director's ^{suggestion} ~~suggestion~~ and continue the school temporarily for a further period of two years. The Director may also be asked to submit a ~~summary~~ report on the continuance of the school after that period.

3. A draft order is submitted. It may be sent to the Finance Department for acceptance prior to circulation. It may be mentioned here that necessary provision has been inserted in the next year's budget for payment of grants to this school in accordance with para 6 of G.O. No. 167 dated 29-1-23 and para 2 of G.O. No. 194 dated 9-2-24.

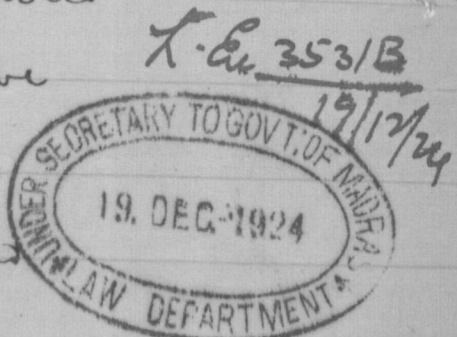

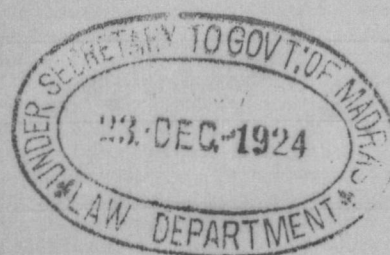

While recommending the temporary continuance of the Lovedale training school for another two years the D.P.O. ^{also} suggest that admissions to the school ^{may} should be made every year instead of every alternate year as at present. This suggestion seems open to no objection. The first batch of candidates admitted in 1925 will complete their training for two years by the end of Dec. 1926, while the second batch



will have only one year's training by that time; and unless the school is discontinued ^{for another term} ~~after that~~, the candidates who would put in one year's training will not be benefited. The D.P.O. may be requested to state whether in these circumstances, admission may be in alternate years as at present.

If the school is continued at all we are involved in its continuance for at least two years since the course of training is a two years' course. If the Secretariat sees any difficulty in sanctioning the extension of the scheme for only two years I am quite prepared to recommend that Government sanction the scheme for 3 years. An alternative suggestion would be to sanction the scheme for two years and at the end of one year consider whether the scheme is likely to be successful or not. If it is not likely to be successful there is no need to make any new admissions but to arrange for its closure at the end of three years. If, however, the scheme is likely to prove successful we might make admissions at the end of one year.

The Principal, the Inspector of European Schools and I myself are all agreed that it is preferable to have yearly admissions ^{rather} than admissions ^{every} alternate year.

Law (E.O.)

As the Director ^{still} considers it preferable to have yearly admissions, the best course would seem to be to continue the school ^{for} two years with yearly admissions and to call for a report as to its further continuance beyond that period. If it is then found that the scheme is not successful, the school may be continued for a further period of one year solely to enable the batch admitted in Jan'y '26 to
