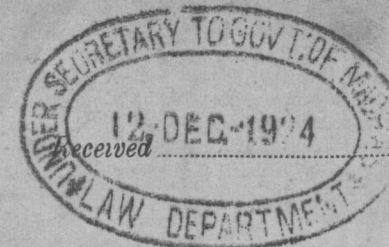

Sir,

A pupil of the Government Junior certified school, Ranipet by name Kalappan is ^{reported} ~~requested~~ to be suffering from Tuberculosis of an acute form and on the advice of the Medical Officer of the school Dr. G.F. Scudder, the Committee of Visitors recommended that steps may be taken for sending the boy to the Union Mission Tuberculosis Sanatorium, Arogyavaram (near Madanapalli) for treatment.

The sanatorium authorities who were addressed in the matter, are willing to take in the boy as a free patient but state that he has to wait till January 1925 for admission. They also state that the boy when brought to the Sanatorium should be provided with the marginally noted articles of

clothing and eating and drinking utensils as required under rule 2 of the rules of the sanatorium an extract of which is herein enclosed. The Superintendent of the school estimates the cost of these articles at Rs.75.

- * 1. Plates
2. Drinking cups
3. Two blankets
4. Three changes of usual clothing
5. Mat
6. Three flannel shirts or jackets

2. In these circumstances I have the honour to request that Government will be pleased to accord early sanction for getting the boy admitted

into the sanatorium mentioned above as soon as a vacancy arises and also for incurring an expenditure of Rs.75 in connection with the purchase of the necessary equipment.

3. The extra expenditure of Rs.75 will be met from the provision for "other contingencies of the school under 31 D(a) (iv) Education - special-Reformatory and certified schools - contingencies . Voted' in the Civil Budget estimate for 1924-25-

2. General wards. Payment is at the following rates (everything included)
Members of the Union Rs.7 per mensem
Non-members of the Union 18 "

A certain number of free beds are available for members of the Union on recommendation of the Representative of their Mission and for members on a certificate from a Gazetted Government Official to the effect that the person in question (or his relative) is known to him to be really indigent and unable to contribute anything to meet the expenses of the stay in the Sanatorium.

The food for patients in general wards is cooked by a Hindu Cook. A few separate kitchens are available for those who wish to supply their own food and cook.

Patients are requested to bring: Plates, drinking cups two blankets, three changes of usual clothing, a small mat and if possible three flannel shirts or jackets

Subject:-Treatment of a boy in the junior certified school, Ranipet, for tuberculosis.



The D.P.I proposes that the boy named, -- Kalappan, in the junior certified school, Ranipet, who is suffering from tuberculosis, may be admitted into the Union Mission Sanatorium near Madanapalle. There is no provision in the Children - Act or in the rules under it for sending a boy from the school to a place away from it for treatment. Under section 35 of the Act, the Govt may, at any time, order a youthful offender or a child to be discharged from a certified school either absolutely or on such conditions as the Local Government approves. It is not clear - whether the intention of the Director is that action should be taken under this section. If so, the question arises whether the boy should be released absolutely or conditionally. It is not known whether the boy was sent to the school on his committing any serious offence or as a vagrant or destitute child. In the case of the Reformatory School, Chingleput, the Government - order the discharge under section 14(a) of the Reformatory Schools Act, of boys suffering from tuberculosis, leprosy or any such serious disease. The D.P.I may be consulted u.o. as to whether the boy in the present case may be formally discharged under section 35 of the Children Act with a view to ~~his admission~~ ^{his admission} into the Sanatorium. The expenditure of Rs.75 proposed to be incurred on the purchase of equipment for the boy may be sanctioned.

I have no objection to the boy being discharged unconditionally. He is a Tiyya boy from Kallai, a suburb of Calicut. He has no father. His mother is employed at Kallai but the person in whose house she works and resides objects to his presence in the house and as there was no one to look after him he ran away about the beginning of 1922 and begged and slept in the street near the Moore Market until he was apprehended and convicted under section 29(1)(a) of Madras Act No. IV of 1920.

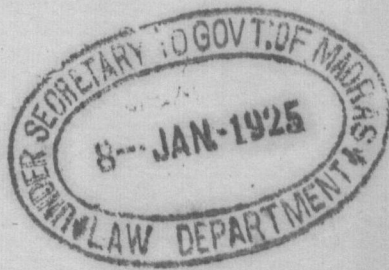
A Draft order directing the immediate discharge of the boy is submitted. The boy's condition is reported to be precarious.

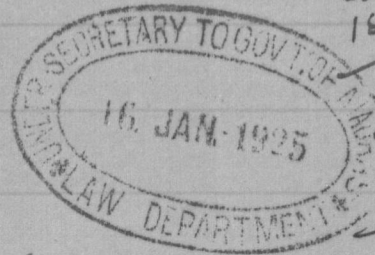
