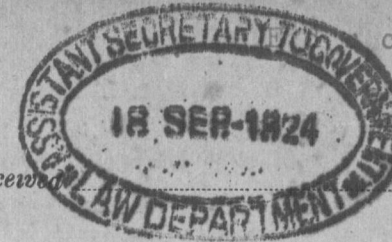

Sir,

I have the honour to state that though under rule III of the rules framed under section 42 (2) of the Madras Elementary Education Act of 1920 applications for admission to aid in any official year are required to be sent in the month of September of the previous year Government was pleased to exempt as a special case those applications which were received out of time for admission to aid for the year 1923-'24 vide, G.O.No.1244.Law Education dated 5th September 1923..

It happens, however, that for the current year also ie., 1924-'25 fourteen out of one hundred and seventy two correspondents of new schools have applied for aid after the prescribed date. If the rules have to be enforced these applications



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applications will have to be rejected on the plea that they have been received out of time. As there has been a great deal of improvement this year in submitting aid applications in due time on the part of the majority of correspondents of schools the council is of opinion that the Government may be addressed to excuse the defaulters once again as a last chance and allow as a special case for this year also the new schools which have applied for aid on other than the prescribed date.

I therefore request that the Government may be pleased to accord necessary sanction to enable the Council to entertain the applications under consideration.

2. According to the District Educational Officer's report, 4 of the 14 schools referred to have since been closed permanently. From the dates of establishment of the remaining 10 schools as ascertained, it is seen that all the schools except one, had been in existence before September 1923, the month in which they should have submitted their applications for aid under rule 3, Chapter I of the rules framed under section 42(2) of the Madras

4. In these circumstances, I am unable to support the present request. The schools can well afford to wait for admission to aid next year. The fact that 4 of them were closed while their admission to aid was under consideration shows that the stability of schools of this kind needs to be tested.
