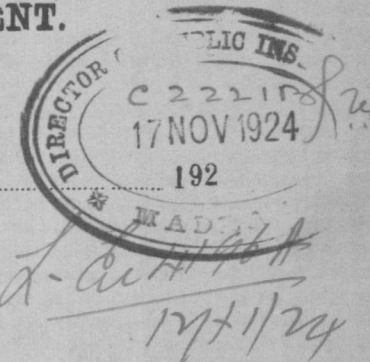

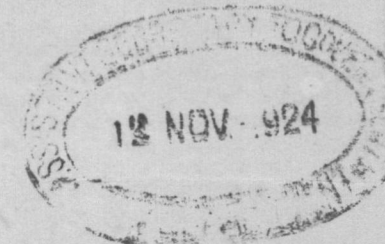

Sir,

I have the honor to state that according to the G.O. No 231 Law (Education) dated 12-2-23 the teaching grant - cheques were sent to the managers of elementary schools -- directly by registered post deducting the registration --- charges from their amounts. But under this system the --- managers have been feeling great difficulty and hardship for encashing their cheques owing to the lack of proper means of communication. They further state that so much money is being wasted for going and encashing their cheques from their villages which are situated very far from ~~their~~ Sub --- Treasuries. Hence they requested to send the grant by money order.

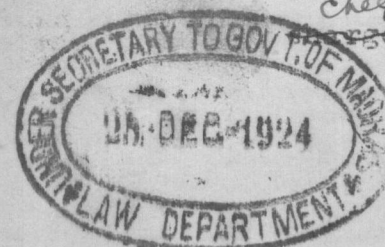

2. The suggestion contained in para 2 of the
President's letter is not altogether clear. The
District Educational Council's office is not an
itinerant office which can be present at each range
headquarters. It is stationed at the headquarters

of

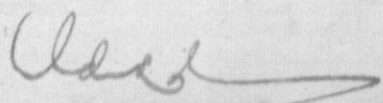
of the District. The President probably means that he will send his clerk with cheques to each range headquarters and have the cheques distributed there. This means a good deal of expenditure on Travelling allowance for the moving office establishment. Furthermore, the system of managers congregating at headquarters of Deputy Inspectors to receive cheques in person was considered undesirable even in the pre Act days.

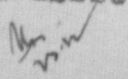
3. Apart from the above, it is not understood how the proposal would mean a saving of expenditure to the managers. Under the existing practice each manager receives the cheque by post and then goes to the Sub-treasury to get it cashed. Under the proposed arrangement he will still have to travel to the range headquarters to receive the cheque and if in the range headquarters there is no sub-treasury (as sometimes happens) he will have to make another journey to the treasury. By this arrangement, the manager is not saved his journey or journeys, while the state is put to the additional cost of travelling allowance referred to above. In these circumstances I am unable to support the District Educational Councils suggestion.

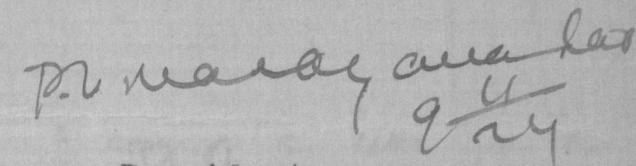
So I suggest to the Government to issue orders to --- distribute the teaching grant cheques to the managers by this Office at each of the Range Headquarters concerned so that the managers may gather there on a certain date and take delivery of the cheques so that there may be no delay on the part of the Office and the managers encashing their cheques at the Sub-Treasuries on that very day.

3. I request the Government may be pleased to consider the point favourably ~~xxxx~~ and issue necessary orders.
