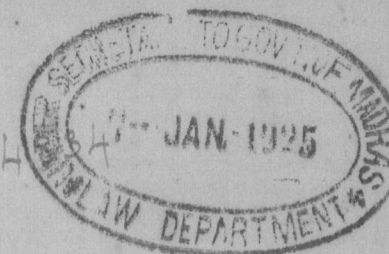

May it Please Your Excellency,

The humble memorial of A. Narayanan Nambiar,
Copyist, District Munsif's Court, Ponnani,
Most respectfully sheweth:—

The memorialist begs to place before Your
Excellency, the following facts for kind consider-
ation.

The memorialist was appointed in the Ponnani
District Munsif's Court as a copyist on the 17th of
November 1914 and was confirmed in that post in
February 1915. Prior to his appointment as copy-
ist, the memorialist had acted as a clerk both in the
Revenue and Registration Departments, and for a
time had been told off to do clerical duty when he
was appointed to act as Amin in the Ponnani Dis-
trict Munsif's Court, previous to his appointment
there as copyist. After the memorialist's acting
term in the Registration Department ceased several
clerks therein got confirmation though they had not
the S. S. L. C. qualification. The memorialist begs
to state that if he had stuck on in the Registration
Department itself he too would have got confirm-
ation as a clerk in due course.

The memorialist begs to point out that he enter-
ed Government Service as a copyist in his 19th year
and that he has striven his utmost to discharge his

duties to the full satisfaction of his superiors, cherishing a strong sense of duty as can be seen from the fact that in the whole course of his 10 years of service he has altogether taken only 5 days leave. The memorialist further begs to submit that he has as a result of his long experience as a copyist and also previous to that as a clerk in the Revenue, Registration and Civil Departments in which he had served as submitted above, a fairly good knowledge of English and is thoroughly conversant with every branch of the office as much as can be expected from passed hands.

The memorialist begs to submit that Government Service is his sole means of livelihood and that his family and himself, the former entirely dependent upon him for support, find it hard even at present to make both ends meet with the pay that he, the only earning member of his family receives. The memorialist begs to mention further that his family and himself will be in straitened circumstances when he will be incapacitated for work on account of age having nothing to fall back upon, as copyists do not come in for pension.

The memorialist therefore begs to request that Your Excellency may be pleased to grant him exemption from educational qualifications necessary for any post in the Judicial Department on Rs. "35-1-40" grade under paragraph 4 of the Public Service Notification dated 15th January 1924, in kind consideration of his long and satisfactory service and the pitiable circumstances in which he and his family will be when he gets too old for service.

For which act of kindness and charity the humble memorialist shall, as in duty bound ever pray.

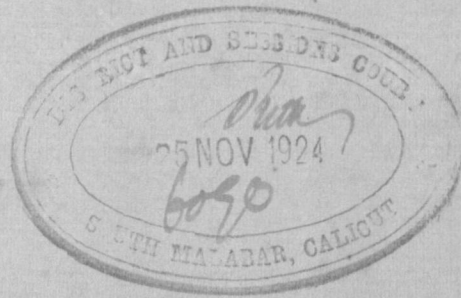

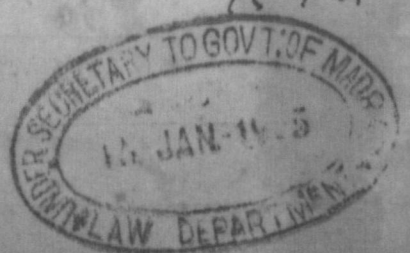
