G.O. No. 2012 Ed, d/ 23rd December 1924  
The High Commissioner had stated that  
State Scholars desirous of admission to the  
colleges at Oxford or Cambridge should  
send in their applications so as to reach  
the College authorities not later than  
the middle of June and that in the  
case of research scholars the application  
with the fullest possible information of  
the subject of research should be before  
the authorities not later than May.  
Accordingly the D.P-2 was asked in  
D.O. No. 3408/c-2, Ed, d/ 23rd December 11  
to forward tentatively with the consideration  
of the applications for the two  
post-graduate scholarships for which  
provision has been suggested in the  
next year's budget and to arrange for  
their submission to the Local Govt.  
with his recommendation by March  
1925.

The High Commissioner's present  
letter shows that the applications of

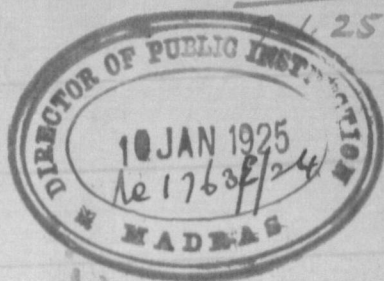

Scholars selected for study at Oxford should reach the college authorities not later than the end of March. This would necessitate the completion of the Government's consideration of the names by at least the 15th March when the Legislative Council would not have passed the budget. It is nearly impossible to do this. In the circumstances we will have to give up any idea of sending scholars to Oxford. May the position be explained to the High Commissioner?

I do not think that we should give up any idea of sending scholars to Oxford. I am now calling for applications for post-graduate scholarships and there is no reason why my recommendation should not reach Government by the middle of February and be considered by Government immediately afterwards on the presumption that funds for a certain definite number of scholarships will be sanctioned by the Legislative Council towards the end of March. Working on the presumption that Government's Budget provision will be approved by the Legislative Council it is possible for Government to make its selection and to advise the Oxford authorities <sup>through the High Commissioner</sup> accordingly. If by any chance the Legislative Council refuses to accept the Budget provision proposed by Government it will be possible for Government to cable immediately to the High Commissioner for India cancelling the names already proposed as scholars for Oxford, the Oxford authorities being informed of the cancellation of a name or names by the High Commissioner. This is the course which I suggest should be adopted.
