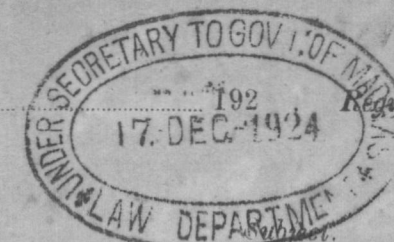

Exemption from Examination Rules--T.A. Abboy Naidu,
Assistant Nazir, District Court, Chingleput.

I am directed to forward for the orders of His Excellency the Governor in Council a petition from T.A. Abboy Naidu, Assistant Nazir, District Court, Chingleput praying for exemption from Examination Rules so as to enable him to hold the post of Deputy Nazir carrying a salary of Rs.60--4--80 per mensem.

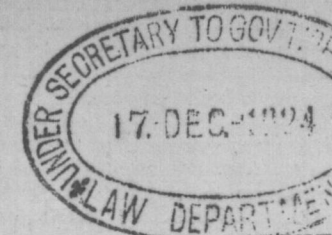
Copy of letter No.3909 dated 20-11-1924 from the District Judge, Chingleput.

I have the honour to forward herewith with my recommendation an application dated 19-11-1924 and addressed to the Government of Madras through the High Court, of one T.A. Abboy Naidu, Assistant Nazir of my Court, for permanent exemption from the operation of the Examination rules, so as to enable him to hold the post of Deputy Nazir carrying under the present time scale a salary of Rs.60-4-80.

2. The Government have already been pleased to exempt him from the provisions of Article 1 of the Public Service Notification, with a view to his promotion to posts on a pay not exceeding Rs.60/- (under the old scale)-vide High Court's proceedings Dis.No.1066 of 1921 dated 10-5-1921. On the strength of that exemption he could be appointed Deputy Nazir under the old grade, when the post carried a fixed pay of Rs.40 or Rs.50. But under the present time scale, he cannot be promoted to that post without further special exemption; and hence this application. I request that it may be favourably considered by the High Court.

Most respectfully sheweth:

The petitioner has put in a service of 16 years in the Judicial department and has served as Amin, Chief Process Writer, Clerk and Assistant Nazir of the District Court of Chingleput.

2. The petitioner having failed to pass the old Matriculation Examination was exempted - permanently from the provisions of Article I of the public Service Notification for posts up to Rs.60/- in the Judicial Department before the introduction of the present Time Scale system. (Vide Order Dis.No.1066 dated 10-5-1921).

3. It would not be presumptuous on the part of the petitioner to add that J.J. Cotton, Esq., I.C.S., had remarked in 1912 when the petitioner was promoted to Ist Grade Amin's post thus, "In consideration of his merit and great usefulness to the office by hardworking.", V. Venugopaul Chetty, Esq., I.C.S., in his letter to High Court for petitioner's exemption for Rs.25/- in 1918 had recommended "Petitioner was an experienced and thoroughly efficient amin" and that -

"he

"he has a working knowledge of English, and, in respect of the satisfactory discharge of the duties pertaining to the post is not at all inferior to candidates who are educationally better qualified." R.A. Jenkins, Esq., I.C.S., had observed in his letter to High Court recommending petitioner's exemption up to Rs.60/- in 1921. "He is well up to the average School Final Clerks' standard and has experience of clerical and Nazareth work "

4. The petitioner has acted as Central Nazir, District Court, Chingleput from 2nd to 26th September '20 in the time of M.R.Ry., V.S. Narayana Iyer, Avl., Ag. District Judge, from 7th to 19th January '21 in the time of R. A. Jenkins, Esq., I.C.S., from 7th January to 21st May '24 and from 1st to 6th July '24. His Honour the District Judge was pleased to order that acting allowances for the post (80-4-120) may be drawn for the petitioner from 20th April to 21st May '24 and from 1st to 6th July '24. He has discharged his duties as Central Nazir to the entire satisfaction of his superiors.

5. The petitioner was exempted up to Rs. 60/- in the old scale which is equivalent to Rs. 60-4-80 grade in the new time scale. In this view the petitioner having been exempted up to Rs.60/- in the old scale is eligible for appointment as Deputy Nazir the pay of which is also Rs. 60-4-80. But High Court's Circular, No.3726 of 22 dated 23rd February 23 requires special exemption for unpassed clerks for appointment as Deputy Nazirs.

As his previous exemption was general, the petitioner therefore humbly prays that the Government would be pleased to exempt him for Deputy Nazir's post considering his experience in the Nazareth Department for the last 16 years and his unblurred service in the

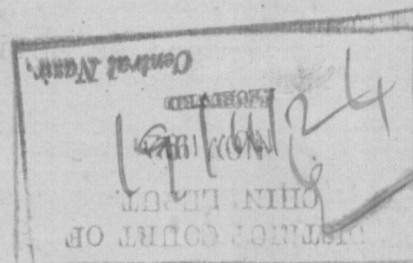
Department as Amin, Chief Process Writer, Clerk, Assistant Nazir and as acting Central Nazir.

Adverting to Government's Memorandum No. 3512B-1 dated 3-1-1925, I have the honour to state that the present pay of T.A. Abboy Naidu, Assistant Nazir of my Court, is Rs. 35/-, and that he will get the first increment of Rs. 1½ in the time scale (35-35-1½-50-1-60) from 20-4-1925. He was appointed Assistant Nazir on 20-4-1923 when the post was newly sanctioned for this Court; and even before that date he was long drawing Rs. 35/- (25 plus 10) as a first grade amin of this Court.

The applicant, J. A. Abbey Naidu, was exempted in 1921 from the provisions of Article 1 of the P. S. Notification for employment on pay not exceeding Rs 60/- per mensem. The St Judge, Chingleput, recommends him for further exemption with a view to enable him to hold the post of Dy Magis on Rs 60-4-80. He has put in 16 years service. It is not known what exactly his present pay is. It is for orders whether as in G.O. No 790 Law (Eds), D. 15.5.24, the High Court may be informed that the application may be renewed when the clerk reaches the top of his present scale of pay and there is an immediate prospect of his being appointed to the Rs 60-80 grade.
