Sir.

With reference to para 7 of G.O. No. 167, Law (Education), dated 29th January 1923, I have the honour to submit a copy of the annual report and a copy of the statement of receipts and charges of the Lovedale Training School for 1924-25 received from the Superintendent of the school.

2. As the institution is now intended for the training of Middle grade ^{Candidates} conditions alone (Vide G.O. No. 8, Law (Education) dated 3rd January 1925) Miss Lorimer should not ~~not~~ have been admitted this year as she is not qualified for training for that grade. As however she has been admitted, the simplest thing is to allow the school to train her for the primary grade and in view of her general educational qualifications and experience as a teacher, I see no objection

to this being done. I have informed the Superintendent accordingly.

3. As regards last year and the current year the difficulty regarding admissions arose from the fact that intimation as to whether the school was to continue or not was received late and consequently applicants were not in a position to know whether they would be admitted or not. Hence some intending applicants went elsewhere. To avoid a repetition of this, it is necessary that orders should be received from Government by the middle of November in the current year as to whether the school should ~~be~~ continue or not. This will depend upon whether the number of applicants indicates that there is a real demand for a school at Lovedale. The management has promised to send to me by the end of October a statement of the applications received and as soon as it reaches me, I shall address Government on the matter.

On February 16th 1925, the school reopened as its continuance for another period of two years was sanctioned. Two students were admitted. Six others were registered but these dropped out on

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on account of failure in the High school Examination and the uncertainty regarding the continuance of the school. However, by the 20th March four Middle grade students were admitted. On the 30th March one other student who had had 10 months teaching -- experience was entertained, but she is to be trained as a Primary grade student as she has not necessary qualifications for a Middle grade training.

The work is being carried on on the same lines as during the last year. The student observe in both the girls' and Preparatory schools for the 1st term of the first year and practise teaching in these schools during the rest of their training. Half the number of students will be admitted each year and as the course is of two years duration from February 1925 onwards, there will be ten students in training.
