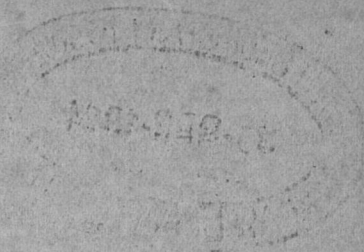

THE LAW (Education) DEPARTMENT.

1181. Will the Hon. the Minister for Education be pleased to state -

(a) whether the Government are aware of the unavoidable dispersal of the mufassal Muhammadan students among the several Colleges in Madras and their enforced concentration, partly in hostel attached to the Government Muhammadan College and partly in the Boddam hostel, ~~taxable~~ ~~the managers thereof to make it conform to modern standards~~ George Town maintained by ^{Muslims} in the ~~Muslims~~ themselves;

(b) if the answer to the above question be in the affirmative whether ~~the~~ Government propose to make an adequate grant-in-aid to the Boddam hostel to enable the managers thereof to make it conform to modern standards by appointing a suitable ~~warden~~ warden and supply other necessary wants? ~~in view of the importance attached by Government to the hostel system and the factors that contribute to the success of the hostels like those of the Adi-Dravidas and the minority students?~~

According to the latest report on Public Instruction (for 1922-23) the number of Muhammadan students in the different colleges in Madras, excluding the Queen Mary's College, was as follows: -

The Presidency College. -----	28	31
The Muhammadan College. -----	24	23
The Wesley College, Royapettah. ---	2	2
The Madras Christian College. ----	40	37
The Law College. -----	14	15
The Medical College. -----	3	6
Total.	111	

There is no information in office as to how many of the above were mufassal students and how many were residing in hostels. It is a fact however that the Boddam Hostel in George Town and the hostel attached to the Muhammadan College are practically the only hostels ^{resorted to by} ~~available to~~ the Muhammadan students ^{in large numbers} ~~population~~ of Madras. The Boddam hostel was constructed wholly with the aid of Govt. funds, the Muhammadan Educational Association having provided the site of the hostel. This hostel is intended to meet the needs of students attending the Law, the Christian and the Medical Colleges. The Muhammadan College hostel answers the needs of students studying in that college. The Muhammadan ~~college~~ students in the Presidency college can find accommodation in the Victoria hostel. It is only the students of the Wesley college that are, if ~~not~~ ^{at} all, likely to be inconvenienced for want of hostel accommodation. But in 1922-23 the number of Muhammadan pupils ^{in that college} was only two. In the face of these facts, the particular grievance which the Hon'ble Member intends to point out is not clear. A recurring grant to the Boddam Hostel seems out of the question. The following answers are for consideration: -
