Sir,

I was granted study leave for one year from the 9th of July 1923. Last year you were kind enough to extend my leave by one more year to enable me to complete my course here. As the Government are aware, I have been doing research work at University College, London, for over 18 months. In view of the quality of my work, the Senate of the London University have already exempted me from the B.Sc. (Hons.) and M. Sc. Examinations and have allowed me to appear direct for the Ph. D. degree. In the normal course I should get the Ph. D. degree next June, but I happen to be engaged in research work of a very important character, and I have been advised by my Professors to stay on here for a further period of six months.

to complete the work, since it is likely to result in the discovery of new facts of great Scientific and Commercial importance. I hope to get the D.Sc. degree if I am allowed to stay here for a few months more. I have already submitted my application for extension of my leave with endorsements by my Tutor and my Professors. I am now submitting this memorial for a consideration of my claims for any Professorship of Physics or of Applied Mathematics that is vacant or likely to become vacant during the next six months. It is unnecessary for me to say anything regarding my capacity for research work, for my Professors and my Tutor have stated all that I need say on my behalf.

If it be not possible to give me a Professorship immediately, I should be very grateful if the Government would be pleased to give me at least a place in the Provincial Service and post me to Madras or some other place where I shall have facilities for carrying on my research work.
