tion--suggestion--rejected.

The Humble petition, G. Bhimasankaran 18/6/25
on behalf of failed F.L. Candidates.

Honoured Sir, on behalf of failed F.L. Candidates of 1925,
I beg to submit the following facts to your Patient counsel
and kind consideration.

- (1) The failed F.L. Candidates have been refused admission into
B.L. Class at Madras without any reason whatsoever.
- (2) Since the October examinations have been introduced by the
University, the failed F.L. Candidates while continuing
B.L. Course and putting attendance in B.L. Class,
may appear in October for F.L. and complete it and
will therefore be eligible to appear for B.L. Degree
examination in April next without wasting one
more year. As a matter of fact his practice is in
vogue at Trivandrum Law College.
- (3) The admission of failed F.L.'s into B.L. does not
entail any additional work or expenditure in the college.
They attend to the same lectures along with their previous
class-mates. No additional work or expenditure is thus
caused. Such admission does not interfere with
- (4) The rules of the University even.
- (4) Refusal of such admissions will cause a heavy loss
to the Educational Department and to the Government.
There are about 112 failed F.L. candidates from Madras
Law College. Refusal of admissions into B.L. will
cause a loss of about Rs 20000/- twenty thousand
rupees to the Government at the rate of Rs 175/-
per candidate.
- (5) It is not fair to drive away failed candidates who
read F.L. in one college to continue B.L. Course
elsewhere in places like Trivandrum.

I therefore request your Honor to direct the Principal
of Law College, Madras through the Director of Public
Instruction to admit for permit F.L. failed candidates
to continue B.L. in the same college. order should be
passed before college opens.

a petition on behalf of the F.L.
Students who failed in the exam &
requests that they may be allowed
to study in the B.L. class, which is
not permissible under the Madras
Rule 14 of the Madras Law College rules. The question
Law College rules was discussed once before and
the Hon. the Minister then noted

1878 No. 1668 (C) as follows:- "we should allow matters

" large increase in strength." The
majority of the members of the College
Council to whom the matter was referred
by the Principal, ~~had objected~~, expressed
themselves against the proposal to
permit students who have undergone
the course for, but have failed in,
the F.L. examination to undergo
