Sir.

In G.O. No. 41 Law (Education) dated 10-1-23, Government approved the proposal of the Director of Public Instruction to discontinue the teaching of English singing to the pupils of the model section of the Presidency Training School, Egmore, and to pay a consolidated salary of Rs. 180 per mensem to the Peripatetic teacher of music, - the amount representing Rs. 150 for her work in European schools, and Rs. 30 for work in the Training section of the Presidency Training School, Egmore, which consisted of European and Anglo-Indian students. Since the establishment of the Lovedale Training School in

in conjunction with the Lawrence Memorial School which was sanctioned in G.O.No. 167 Law(Education)dated 29-1-23, the Training section for European and Anglo-Indian students in the Presidency Training School, Egmore, has been abolished, and a combined section both for European and Anglo-Indian and Indian students has been opened. As all these teachers are intended for service in Indian schools alone, the teaching of English singing even to European and Anglo-Indian students in the Training section was discontinued in conformity with the policy of abolising the teaching of that subject to Indian pupils. It is regretted that this circumstance was overlooked when applying in this office letter R.O.C.No. 20 E/25 dated 19- 1- 25 for the sanction of Government for the retention of the post of Peripatetic Teacher of Music for a further period of one year from 1st March 25. The teacher has now no work in the Presidency Training School, Egmore, and I have the honour therefore to request that the words " and the Presidency Training School, Egmore" in G.O.No.149 Law(Education) dated 2- 2- 25, be deleted.

2. I beg further to request that no reduction be made in the pay of the post on account of the exclusion of the Presidency Training School, Egmore, from the teachers' sphere of work. The pay of the post has since been increased from Rs.180 to Rs.200 in G.O.No.728 Mis Law(Education), dated 8-5-25, and I submit that this amount is not too much for the teachers' work in European schools alone.

In G.O. No. 728 Law (Edn.) dated 8-5-1925, the
Peripatetic teacher of music was sanctioned a
consolidated pay of Rs. 200 p.m. This amount has
been fixed as follows:--

2. With the opening of the training school for European and Anglo India women at Lovedale, the training section of the Presidency Training School for Mistresses, Egmore, was ordered to be gradually abolished. The peripatetic teacher has consequently no work now in the Presidency Training School for Mistresses, Egmore. This was not brought to the notice of Government when the continuance of the post of the peripatetic teacher was sanctioned in G.O. 149 Law Edn. dated 2-2-25 or when the grant of a conveyance allowance to the teacher was applied for in January 1925.

The D.P.I., while bringing to the notice of Govt. the fact referred to at K above, requests that no reduction need be made in the pay of the post on account of the exclusion of the Presidency Training school, Egmore, from the sphere of work of the peripatetic teacher, on the ground that this amount is not too much for the teacher's work in European Schools. The Law Department support the D.P.I.'s proposal.

3. The proposal of the D.P.I. seems unusual.

his request amounts to making payment for a service which is not required. It has not been shown by facts and figures that considerable increase has been made to the duties of the peripatetic teacher so as to justify the continuance of a pay of Rs.200 p.m. Strictly speaking there is justification for reducing the pay of the post from Rs.200 to Rs.170 p.m. The point for consideration is whether the Govt. having sanctioned the peripatetic teacher a consolidated pay of Rs.200 so recently as May 1925, will, in the light of the information now furnished and available with them, reduce the pay of the post from Rs.200 to Rs.170 p.m.
