1	The Imperial Secretariat Library (Education Section).	1. Books may be consulted on the spot by teachers mentioned in rule 2 below with the permission of the Librarian. 2. Books may be borrowed and removed from the library by :— (i) professors, readers and lecturers of Indian Universities, and (ii) professors, readers and lecturers of colleges. 3. Applications for the loan of books should be addressed to the Educational Commissioner with the Govt. of India through the Vice-Chancellors, Pro-Vice-Chancellors or Principals. 4. No book may be kept by a borrower for more than 30 days. 5. Full responsibility for the care of the books borrowed will rest with the borrower who will be required to replace, or pay for, any book lost or damaged. 6. The borrower will bear the expenses of transit both ways. 7. The Educational Commissioner with the Government of India reserves the right to refuse to lend any book without assigning reasons. Any books in the library, excluding a certain number in general demand for reference purposes, may be borrowed on deposit of their value. This value will be determined by the Director General of Commercial Intelligence and must be deposited at the time of borrowing (or in advance by those borrowers who ask for books to be sent by post). 2. No person shall take more than three volumes on loan at one time. 3 Books may be retained for seven days by residents in Calcutta and neighbouring localities, such as Barrackpore, Dum-Dum, etc., and for twenty-one days by residents in other parts of India. The latter period will include the time of transit by post. The cost of carriage of books will be borne by borrowers, who will also be responsible for their being properly packed and returned in good condition. 4. In the event of a book not being returned to the library within the time specified in rule 3 the deposit will be liable to forfeiture in order to meet the cost of replacement. Applications for loans should be submitted through recognised authorities such as the Vice-Chancellors, Pro-Vice-Chancellors of Universities, or the principals of colleges who will be held responsible for the safe return of books and will be required to replace, or pay for, any book lost or damaged.
