I regret to point out that nothing further has been done in the matter of providing additional accommodation for the Municipal High School. When I last saw the Hon'ble the Minister for Education and the Director of Public Instruction, it was understood that orders would be passed enabling us to proceed with at least one of the 3 proposed additional blocks. Nothing further has transpired and as the school reopens tomorrow, the Headmaster draws my attention to the circumstances that a very large number of pupils will have to be refused admission. At my interview today with the Hon'ble the Minister, the Minister was pleased to direct me to rent a building and not to refuse admissions. Under these circumstances, I am arranging to rent a building for 3 months from the 22nd instant at a rent which I shall intimate in a day or two.

As directed by the Minister, I am forwarding you this letter in order that very early steps may be taken to sanction the construction of the first of the 3 proposed blocks of buildings. If sanction is sent me by wire, I shall arrange with a responsible contractor to have 1 block constructed within three or four months.

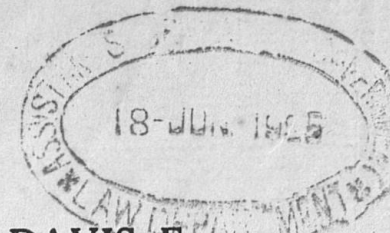
