Sir,

In inviting a reference to G.O. No. 641 Law -- (Education), dated 29th April 1925, I have the honour to point out that there is no provision in the G.O. for making medical inspection compulsory on the managements of schools except in the case of Government schools. I presume that the intention of --- Government is that the scheme should be compulsorily introduced in all secondary schools under public and private management. Since, however, the G.O. does not specifically state that the introduction

introduction of the scheme is compulsory, I request that you will be so good as to obtain the orders of Government on the point.

2. In the event of my presumption in paragraph (1) supra-being correct, I would suggest that the --- addendum to the G.O. necessary to give effect to -- Government's intention should take the form ^{of} a clause to the effect that subjection to Medical Inspection should be a condition of the admission of a pupil and his continuance in a recognised school in this - Presidency.

3. I request the favour of early orders of -- Government on this reference.

Subject : - Medical inspection of schools.



At the conference held by the Hon'ble the Minister for Education on 9th September 1924 which was attended by the Surgeon General, the Director of Public Instruction and the Secretaries to Government in the Local Self Government and the Law Departments, the question whether medical inspection should be made compulsory in the schools that come within the scope of G.O.No. 641 Law (Edn), dated 29th April 1925 was considered and the conclusion was arrived at that inspection should be voluntary to begin with and that the question of making it compulsory might be taken up later. Agreeably to this decision, the current year's budget contains provision for the conduct of medical inspection in all Government Secondary and Training schools for men and in one-third of the ^{number} of ~~20~~ of aided schools and schools managed by local bodies. It is not anticipated that more than one-third of ^{the number of} aided schools and schools under local bodies will adopt the scheme of medical inspection in the 1st year.

The Director of Public Instruction may see the above note u.o.
