Medical inspection-instructions laid down -
G.O.No. 641 (law) Edn, 29th April 1925- Communicated -
Endorsement No. 13840-1 L & M., dated 23-5-25.

In paragraph 3 of the G.O. it is stated that Civil Assistant Surgeons, preferably Government officers, should be selected for medical inspection in the case of schools under local bodies. I think it would be rather advantageous to have a resident medical man where one is available in order to - - secure continuity than have a Government servant who must necessarily be a bird of passage. I submit further that a Sub-Assistant Surgeon who is a registered medical practitioner need not be excluded as Civil Assistant Surgeons are - -

confined to more important towns only.

Medical inspection of schools - *Employment*
of Sub. Asst. Surgeons -

In paragraph 1, (3) of G.O. No. 641 Law (Education), dated 29th April 1925, it has been laid down that management of schools should submit the name of the medical officer to be entrusted with the medical inspection of schools for the approval of the Director of Public Instruction. It is further laid down that, as far as possible, Government officers of the grade of Civil Assistant Surgeons should be selected. The President, District Board, Ramnad, points out that it will ~~not~~ be advantageous to have a resident medical man, where one is available, in order to have continuity. He doubts the possibility of securing Civil Assistant Surgeons as medical officers for the remuneration that managers might be prepared to pay and accordingly enquires whether the Government will take objection to officers of the grade of Sub-Assistant Surgeons (now L.M.P.s) who are registered medical practitioners being appointed resident medical officers to secondary schools.

2 The Government order only says that Civil Assistant Surgeons should as far as possible be appointed. It does not rigidly exclude registered medical practitioners of lower qualifications. It is difficult to give a general reply to the President. Under the Government order the name of the medical practitioner has to be approved by the Director in consultation with the Surgeon General. ~~They~~ ^{Each case} will have to be considered ~~case~~ ^{on} its merits. A draft order is submitted.
