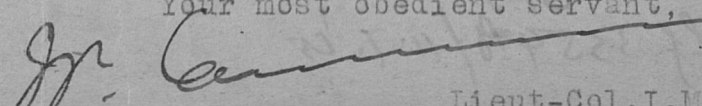
(Education) Department, dated the 6th June 1925, I have the honour to submit the case of V. Seshachalam Naidu, the permanent typist of my office, and request that Government may be pleased to exempt him for employment in the Jail Department on the scale of Rs. 60-4-80. He has passed the Lower Secondary Examination and has studied up to the Matriculation class. He is qualified in Typewriting - Advanced Grade. He was entertained as a clerk in the Office of the Registrar of the Diocese of Madras in September 1906. As promotion was slow in that office and with a view to better his prospects, he joined this office as a Typist in September 1917, and has now

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put in 19 years' service under Government. Prior to joining this office, he was temporarily exempted twice for employment as Head clerk and Record Keeper in the Diocesan Registry Office, in G.Os. Nos. 198/R Edn. Department, dated the 22nd May 1912 and 258/R Edn. Department, dated the 3rd September 1915. From the enclosed copy of certificate granted to him by the Registrar of the Diocese of Madras, it will be seen that this clerk was performing his duties very efficiently. As Typist in my office, he is drawing Rs.54/- (Rs.44 in the scale of Rs.35-60 and Rs. 10/- Special pay for advanced qualification in Typewriting), and it will take 14 years more to reach the maximum pay -Viz., Rs. 60/- of the grade. As he has already put in 19 years service, he will naturally retire before he becomes eligible to draw Rs.60/-. He has carried out the duties of a clerk, off and on, during leave vacancies, and has been tried on several occasions in the various branches of this office and discharged his duties to my entire satisfaction. His only disability, as far as I am aware, is that he has not got the educational qualifications required by the Rules, but in point of education and ability, I think he is equal to many passed men. As he is desirous of bettering his prospects and shows a great aptitude for clerical work, I propose appointing him as a clerk in the scale of Rs. 60-4-80 when a suitable opportunity arises. He is reported to be very willing and good at his work and bears a good character. In consideration of his satisfactory work and the long service he has put in, I recommend that he be granted the necessary exemption for employment in this Department on the scale of Rs. 60-4-80, as he deserves the concession. If promoted, he will be financially benefitted by a trifling amount, as shown below:-

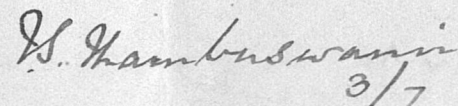

The J. G. recommends that he may be exempted
from Examination rules for appointment as
clerk in the scale of Rs 60- 4. 80. The reasons
for the exemption are fully set out in the
letter. The typist has put in 19 years
service. He has already worked in a clerical
capacity in the Diocesan Registry Office,
Madras, though the period is not specified.

is further considered in this department.
