Sir. In their order No. 1245, Home (Education), dated 18th September 1918, Government have approved proposal to incur an expenditure of Rs 2200/- per annum for the provision of conveyances (8 carts) for the Gosha pupils of the Government Hobart Secondary and Training School for Mistresses, Royapettah. Subsequently, the maximum amount of expenditure on the provision of conveyances for the school was in G.O.No. 1071, Home (Education), dated 17th September 1920, raised to Rs 2750 per annum. The strength of the institution has since increased and the Superintendent of the school now reports that the existing number of carts will ^{not} be sufficient especially

when the fresh batch of students (about 48 in number) is admitted into the Training and Model sections of the school, this year. ~~For the additional strength~~ It is also reported that two verandahs in the school building are now available for accommodating the additional pupils in the model school. ^{For the additional strength} the Superintendent considers that two more carts are absolutely necessary. I have, therefore, the honour to request that you will be so good as to obtain the sanction of Government for increasing the number of carts for the school from eight to ten and to raise the maximum expenditure from 2750 to 3438 per annum with effect from 1st July 1925.

2. The additional expenditure required for the current official year will be met by reappropriation.

3. I request that Government will be pleased to pass early orders on this reference.

Subject : - Raising of the allotment for conveying Gosha pupils to the Govt. Hobart Secondary and Training School for Muhammadan ~~Wom~~ ^{mistress} Royapettah.

The practice of providing conveyances at Govt. cost to the Gosha pupils of the Hobart Training School is one of long standing - vide the letter of the Director of Public Instruction at page 2 of G.O.No. 842 Educational, dated 12th September 1913. It has also been definitely accepted ~~that~~ ^{that} the ~~entire~~ ^{entire} charge ^(share them) from provincial funds ~~in 1920~~ ^{in 1920} the Government authorised the incurring of an expenditure of Rupees 2750 on the provision of conveyances and with this amount ^{eight} ~~8~~ carts are being engaged. Last year in-
sufficiency of carts formed the subject of interpellation at the Legislative Council and the Hon'ble ^{the} Minister gave an undertaking that he would consider ^(when necessary) the question of increasing the allotment for conveyances so as to enable the school to engage a larger number of carts. The Director ~~now~~ reports that the 8 carts now hired are inadequate and that ^{two} ~~2~~ additional carts have to be engaged. He accordingly asks that the amount made available for hiring conveyances may be raised from 2750 Rs. ~~2750~~ to Rs. 3,438. Submitted that the Director's proposal may be accepted. It is stated that the ~~educational~~ ^{additional} expenditure in the current year can be met by reappropriation.

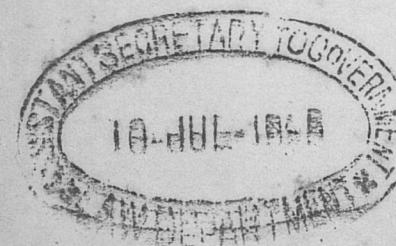
