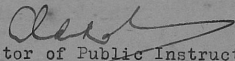

Sir,

In forwarding herewith the Budget Estimate of --- Receipts and Charges of the District Educational Council -- for the year 1925-26 along with the Resolution of the ----- Council, I have the honour to state that in G.O.No.516 --- Home(Education) dated 2-4-1921, a dead salary of Rs. 30/- - each is sanctioned for the two clerks, one of whom should - be a typist without the benefits of any scale or grade or - of even Provident Fund as in every other Government depart- ment# and Boards ^{where} the clerks are started on Rs. 35/- . In view of the heavy work and the present high cost of living, the Council including Mr. P.F.Tyson Esq. D.E.O. of Ganjam --- resolved, after mature deliberation, that it is quite just - and reasonable to raise their salary to Rs.35/- each. ---- Calculating at this rate of Rs.35/- per each clerk, a sum of Rs.1152(an increase of Rs.120/- per annum over previous ---- amount) is shown on the debit side against Col.1, salaries - and allowances of clerks and servants.

2. Building grants:- A sum of Rs. 2500/- is shown - for 1925-26 under Building grants in 1925-26 Budget estimate

as against Building grants of Rs. 6787/- in the Revised ---
Budget estimate for 1924-25. The reason for this demand of
Rs.2500/- is that of the balance of last year, i.e.Rs.6787/-
as sum of Rs.5000/- have to be paid this year towards Rajah's
Girls' school, Mandasa and Parlakimedi as per G.O.s 1659 ---
dated 23-11-23 and G.O.1194 dated 22-1-23 and the balance is
to be paid towards grants already sanctioned for other ----
schools. So there will be no pie practically left for ----
1925-26. The cyclone also caused considerable damages to -
buildings. Further the number of schools are increasing --
every year and the applications for Building grants under --
Chapters II & IV are increasing, the council estimated that -
a payment of Rs.50/- on an average for each school and that
for about 50 schools in 1925-26.

3. Grants for Furniture and books:- The council resolved
to encourage teachers to see that necessary books and appli-
ances as required under Chapter III of the rules and by the -
new syllabus framed by the council are kept by them up to ---
date. Moreover the cyclones of last year and this year have
committed havoc especially with regard to furniture, Books --
Etc. Hence the amount of Rs. 1000/- has been asked for the
year 1925-26.

4. Travelling Allowance:- As regards T.A. an amount
of Rs. 1000/- is shown on the debit side against Col.3, T.A.
of President and Members of D.E.C. The reason of requesting
for such an amount is due to the claiming by members of ----
halting allowance and also for payment to members inspecting-
schools. As regards halting allowance, the G.O.1647 dated -
17-11-21 no doubt disallows it. But when this G.O.was ----
passed, the rates of T.A.granted to members then in force ---
were double Second class fares for railway journey and ~~canal~~
the corresponding rates for road and canal journeys. Under
such conditions it was fair and equitable that separate halt-
ing allowances were not paid.

But the subsequent G.O.No. 33 dated 10-1-22 reduced the rates of T.A. to Single second class fares which do not leave any margin to cover reasonable incidental charges ---- while the Government T.A.rules clearly contemplate halting -- allowances besides T.A. Further it is unfair that the -- President is not given any halting allowance if he wishes to inspect the schools in any place or area. So the Government may be pleased to allow a halting allowance of Rs. 3/- diem to him also.

Secondly this is necessary in view of the sub-committee meetings being generally posted a day or two before the general meeting to consider important subjects and ----- especially of members coming from distant places like Chicacole Parlakimedi and Russelkonda from a distance of about 50 miles; otherwise they are not expected to pay out from their pockets

5. Printing Charges:- An amount of Rs. 500/- is ---- shown under Budget estimate for 25-26 separately under col.4 debit side for Printing the lists of recognised schools and for employment of a sweeper in 25-26. A sum of Rs. 25/- is also shown in the revised estimate for 24-25 on the debit -- side against other items to meet the charges of the sweeper - till the end of March 1925 as sanctioned in G.O.No.1852 dated 25-11-24. The lists of schools have to be printed next year (25-26-)

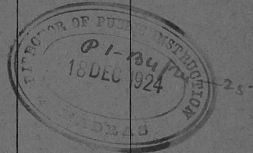

The budget estimate for 1925-26 of the D. & C. Gaungan, as approved by the Government, is annexed to these proceedings.

2. The amount provided under "Teaching grant", in the budget estimate for 1925-26, is provisional and liable to revision.

3. Under "Office and establishment expenses" credit has been allowed for a sum of Rs 2,264/- Against this, the Council has already received a sum of Rs 1,732/- under the sanction accorded in G.O. no 523 Law (Education) dated

9-4-1925. The President is requested to report the balance due to the Council in the Current year after deducting the Savings, if any, remaining with the Council from the grant sanctioned in 1924-25 for the purpose.

P.V.K. 15-7-25. 4 The attention of the President

is invited to go NO. 362 Law (Edn) dated 14th March 1925. The Govt are unable to entertain the proposal that travelling allowances should be granted to members attending meetings of the D.E.C. with the President while on tour.

5 The President is informed that it is open to the Council to revise the pay of the clerks in its employ, provided the total allotment for the pay of clerks and peons is not exceeded.

6 No provision has been made in the civil budget estimate for 1925-26 for the payment of building or furniture grants to aided elementary schools.
