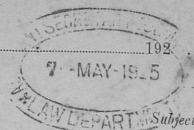

Sir.

In G.O. No. 722 Law (Education) dated the 13th June 1922, Government have empowered me to exempt from the examination rules unpassed men for appointments carrying a scale of pay Rs. 35-60 in the moffussil and Rs. 40-65 in the Madras City. An annual statement showing the number of exemptions thus granted during the year together with a certificate to the effect that bona fide efforts were made without success to obtain passed candidates has to be submitted to Government.

It is proposed to exempt the following unpassed candidates who are not ex-military men from the operation of article 1 of the Public Service notification in considera-

of the fact that they have put in long service in the Jail Department. I therefore request that the Government may be pleased to approve their exemption.

D. Subramenia Ayyar.

He is the permanent attender of my office and as he showed special aptitude for clerical work, he was transferred to the Central Jail, Bellary, as an acting clerk on 1st February 1922, from which date he continues to act as clerk. He joined the Jail Department on the 5th August 1918. He went on deputation as a typist in the Tehsildar's office at Krishnagiri where he worked for a year. He has also acted as clerk in this office on several occasions and I had no occasion to find fault with his work. He has studied up to the pre-matriculation class and has passed elementary grade in typewriting. With a view to confirm him in the regular line he was permitted to appear for the Jail Test examination but the Commissioner for Government examinations declines to give out the result pending his exemption from the examination rules. He was transferred as manufactory clerk of the Central Jail, Coimbatore on the 30th January 1925 and the Superintendent also recommends his confirmation.

P. Rajaiah Maidu.

He was entertained as manufactory clerk, Central Jail, Coimbatore on the 13th October 1913 and was transferred to the Berstai School, Tanjore, as such on the 12th March 1925. He was confirmed as manufactory clerk on Rs. 35-60 with reference to the revised pay sanctioned in G.O. No. 1425, dated the 8th June 1922. The Accountant General, Madras requires that I should sanction his exemption from the examination rules with a view to enable him to draw increment in the time scale. He has done his work throughout his service to the entire satisfaction of the Superintendents under whom he has worked. He has studied up to Vth form and is fit for the post he is now holding.

T.D. Doraiswami Pillai.

He has studied up to Vth form and has put in 15 years' service in this department as a manufactory clerk on Rs. 35-60. He is doing his duties satisfactorily and is reported to be good at his work.

S. Sundara Rama Ayyar.

He was entertained in the Department on 12th February 1921 as a Manufactory clerk. He has studied up to the Vth Form and has passed the Lower Grade in Type Writing. His work is satisfactory and he is well reported on by the Superintendent.

C. S. Sarangapani Ayyangar.

He was an acting typist in the Penitentiary, Madras. He has acted as a clerk frequently in the same Jail, and has proved himself capable of holding that post. He has studied up to the School Final Class. He is now doing the duties of a temporary clerk in the Subjail, Korpaput, which was sanctioned temporarily in connection with the Korpaput Drainage Scheme. The Superintendent, Subjail, Korpaput reports favourably and recommends his confirmation.

In view of their long and satisfactory service in the Department, I strongly recommend that the above clerks may be exempted from the provisions of article 1 of the Public Service Notification for employment as Manufactory clerks in the scale of Rs. 35-60.

V. Seshachalam Maidu. He is the permanent typist of my office. He has passed the Lower Secondary Examination, Advanced Grade in the Typewriting Examination and has studied up to the Matriculation class. He has put in about 19 years' service (Superior) in Government employment and was temporarily exempted by Government from the operations of the Examination Rules twice for his employment as Head clerk and Record Keeper in the Office of the Registrar of the Diocese of Madras - Vide G.O's Nos. 198/R, Educational Department, dated the 22nd May 1912 and 256/R, Educational Department, dated the 3rd September 1915. He was doing the duties of a clerk off and on in leave vacancies. He has been tried

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on several occasions in the various branches of this office and discharged his duties most satisfactorily. He is now drawing Rs.44/- plus Rs.10/- Special pay in the scale of Rs.35-60 and I strongly recommend that he may be granted the necessary exemption for his employment in this Department in the scale of Rs. Rs.60--60. If my proposal is approved and he be appointed in that grade, the special pay - Viz., Rs.10/- he is now drawing will be absorbed in his pay.

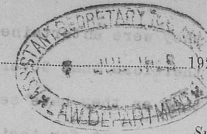

The attention of the I. G. is invited to paragraph 2 of G.O. 722 Law (Em) of 13.6.22, under which he is empowered to grant exemption from examination rules to unpassed candidates subject to the limits prescribed therein. In his letter referred to above he has submitted to Govt cases in which he is himself competent to pass orders along with those which require Govt sanction. The I. G. of Prisons is requested to separate the two sets of cases and resubmit those calling for Govt sanction to this department at an early date.

In resubmitting my letter No.G. 289 dated 2-5-25

I have the honour to state that the object of submitting the cases of the unpassed candidates under reference was to obtain the special approval of Government to my proposal to exempt them from the provision of article 1 of the Public Service Notification. Under G.O. No. 722, Law (Education) dated the 13th June 1922, I am empowered to grant exemption in these cases but under para 5 of the G.O. I have to certify that bonafide efforts were made without success to secure the services of passed candidates, and it is not possible to append such a certificate in

The end of April 1925 a statement showing the number of exemptions granted by him in the year ending 31st March 1925, together with a certificate signed by him to the effect that bona fide efforts were made without success to obtain passed candidates in the cases referred to. The letter submitted by him does not contain the required statement or certificate. It is requested, therefore, to submit at once a necessary statement with certificate.

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(K) respect of these individuals as they were entertained long before the G.O. was issued. I request therefore that Government may be pleased to permit me to exempt them as they have served faithfully in the Department and deserve encouragement for their good work.

2. I would add to the names already put forward, that of acting Jailer S. Nallasawmi Pillai of the Sub-Jail, Nellore. He is a permanent Chief Head warder on Rs. 33 in the grade of Rs. 30-1-40. He has passed the Lower Secondary Examination in the 1 class; has studied up to the Matriculation class; and has put in 19 years service in this Department. As he showed an aptitude for executive work he was specially selected for promotion to the grade of Sub-Jail Jailer and has been doing duty as such in the Sub-Jail, Nellore, from 1-8-1922 to the satisfaction of his superior officers. I recommend his exemption from the examination rules for employment as Jailer in one of the three Sub-Jails carrying a scale of pay of Rs. 35-60.

3. With regard to the case of clerk V. Seshachalam Naidu I am addressing Government in a separate communication.

Subject : - Exemption from examination rules - unpassed men in the Jail department.

16-1-4 of In May last the I.G. of Prisons submitted proposals for the exemption of certain clerks employed in the jail department from the provisions of Article 1 of the Public Service Notification. No reference was made to the orders in G.O. No. 722 Law (Education), dated 13-6-22, in which powers of exemption were delegated to the I.G. of Prisons subject to the conditions laid down in paragraph 2. The I.G.'s letter was therefore returned to him for revision. The I.G. has now resubmitted the case. In doing so, he has separated the case of one of the clerks (V. Seshachalam Naidu) but has included the case for exemption of acting jailor, sub-jail, Nellore, S. Nallasawmi Pillai. He also states that the special approval of Govt. is necessary to exempt them as under paragraph 2 of G.O. No. 722 Law (Edn.) dated 13-6-22, he could not certify that bonafide effort were made without success to secure the services of

passed candidates and it is not possible to do so as they were entertained long before the G.O. was issued. He further requests that he may be permitted to grant the exemption in these cases.

It is submitted the men referred to in the letters of the I.G. of Prisons have been long in the service of Govt. and particularly in the appointments

which exemption is now recommended. Their work is also satisfactory. As regards delegation to the I.G., the power of exemption in these cases, it is submitted, these powers have not been given to subordinate officers and the I.G. has not shown any special reasons
