2. These training classes were opened in July 1917 (vide G.O.No.1105 Home(Education) dated 29- 8- 17, and have been in existence for the past 8 years producing good results in the Training School Leaving Certificate examination, year after year.

(1) Secondary Training class, Nellore.

This training class caters for the need of the teachers not only in the Nellore District but also of those in the Cuddapah District. The following statement exhibits the number of teachers who underwent training during each of the years 1922- 23 to 1924- 25 and the probable strength during 1925- 26.

(ii) Secondary Training class, Dindigul.

This training class caters for the need of both Madura and Ramnad Districts and there is also a large demand for trained teachers of the Secondary grade, as the Presidents of Taluk Boards are increasingly employing trained Secondary grade teachers in their schools. The following statement gives the number of teachers who underwent

underwent training in the school during each of the years 1922- 23 to 1924- 25.

(iii) Secondary Training Class, Bellary.

This training class caters for the Ceded Districts (four Districts) and the following statement gives the number of teachers who underwent training during each of the last three years:-

The District Educational Officer, Bellary expects a strength of 70 (40 Juniors and 30 seniors) in 25- 26. Attention is in this connection invited to para 2 of G.O.No.1163 Misc Law(Education), dated 16- 7- 24. In this G.O. Government sanctioned a temporary clerk for the school on Rs.35 for a period of one year and the above sanction expires on 24- 8- 25. As the clerical work in the school which contains 6 sections continues to be heavy and as all other Secondary/Training schools have each been given the services of a clerk on Rs.35- 60 the permanent retention of the post is recommended for favourable consideration. Since the above mentioned three institutions meet a real want and justify their existence, I recommend their permanent retention with effect from 1- 7- 26.

The District Educational Officer, Tinnevely expects a strength of 70(40 Juniors and 30 seniors) in 1925- 26. There are two other Secondary Training classes in the District (both of them aided institutions one attached to the Thirthapati High School, Ambasamudram and the other to the C.M.S. Training school, Palamcottah, where admissions are made in alternate years.

The District Educational Officer, Tinnevely, who was requested to report upon the necessity for the continuance of a Secondary Training class under Government management at Tinnevely and to consider the question of abolishing the class or of making admissions into it in alternate years, is of opinion that the need for trained Secondary grade teachers in the District is still great and that it will be possible for him to arrive at a decision in the matter only after a further trial. He therefore, requests sanction for the continuance of the training class till the end of April 1928 and I support his request.

3. With the permanent retention of the training classes at Nellore, Dindigul and Bellary, it will be necessary to include for the sake of uniformity the six posts of Assistants sanctioned for them(3 on Rs.125 per mensem and 3 on Rs.93½ per mensem in the cadre of

of licentiate school Assistants and I request that Government will be pleased to sanction the inclusion of the posts in the appropriate cadre ie(one post in the 1st grade on 150- 10- 250; 2 posts in the IIrd grade on Rs.100- 10- 150 and 3 posts in the IIIrd grade on Rs.75- 5- 100) with effect from 1- 7- 26. The clerks(except at Bellary) are already in the regular scale of Rs.35- 60.

4. The financial effect of the proposal regarding the permanent retention of the Secondary Training classes at Nellore, Dindigul and Bellary and the inclusion of the six posts in the cadre of School Assistants from 1- 7- 26, would result in a saving of Rs.650/- as shown hereunder.

Secondary Training Classes attached to certain Government Institutions - Retention.

The proposals of the Director are : --

(i) that the secondary training classes attached to the Government training schools for masters at Nellore Dindigul and Bellary may be retained permanently;

(ii) that the six posts of school assistants sanctioned for the classes may be included in the cadre of school assistants;

(iii) that the temporary clerk on Rs. 35 sanctioned for the class at Bellary in G.O.No. 1163 Law (Edn), dated 16-7-24 may be retained permanently in the scale of Rs. 35-60; and

(iv) that the secondary training class attached to the Government training school for masters, Tinnevely, may be continued till the end of April 1925, and

2. These training classes were opened in 1917 and the average number of teachers trained in each annually in

the last three years has been as follows :--

Nellore 54 Bellary 40
Dindigul 37 Tinnevely 45

The permanent retention of the class at Tinnevely

is not recommended now as there are two aided training institutions in the district and as it may be possible to abolish the Government institution after a time when the demand for trained teachers becomes less. In any case the Dist.Edl. Officer wants to wait for some time more.

The proposal of the Director of Public Instruction are acceptable and may, if it is submitted, be approved. - They result in a saving of Rs. 57 a year.

3. A draft order is submitted. It may go to Finance for acceptance.

2. The necessity for the permanent retention of these 3 training classes is explained in para 2 of the D.P.I.'s letter on pp 2-3 C.F. As these classes have been in existence for the past 8 years and as they meet a real want, Finance may agree to their permanent retention with effect from 1st July 1926.

3. The cadre of School Assistants consists of 3 grades

I grade	150-10-250	for 12 % of cadre
II ..	100-10-150	.. 40 % ..
III ..	75-5-100	.. 48 % ..

On the above basis, the distribution of the 6 appointments now proposed will be as shown below:-

The D.P.I.'s proposal to allow 1 post in the I Grade, 2 posts in the II grade and 3 posts in the III grade may be accepted.

4. The proposal for the continuance of the secondary training class attached to the Government training school for masters at Tinnevely up to the end of April 1928 may also be agreed to.

5. The draft order may be accepted and the sanction registered as No.111 of 1925-26.
