Sir.

In submitting herewith the applications of T.

Lakshmanan and K. Rangachari, two Upper Subordinate Students of the College of Engineering, Guindy, requesting exemption from the completion of the full practical course, I have the honour to state that the Superintending Engineer, Madras Circle, considers that as the students have completed an 11 months' course of practical training on 10-6-25 and 7-6-25 respectively, and as they have not availed themselves of the 30 days' leave allowed under Rule 67 of the rules relating to the constitution and working of the College of Engineering

(P.T.O.)

Engineering, Guindy - (vide G.O.No.1604 Law (Education) dated 12-11-23), they may be considered to have satisfactorily completed the course (vide copy of letter No.914.W dated 14-5-25 of the Superintending Engineer enclosed). As the dates of discharge in the case of both the students have already expired, I have the honour to recommend that the Superintending Engineer's proposal be accepted.

2. I am, however, of opinion that though Rule 67 of the College Rules admits of leave being granted during the practical course for a period or aggregate of periods not exceeding one month per annum to meet cases of unavoidable absence due, for example, ^{to} sickness, it does not appear that it was intended to create a right to have an 11 months' course and a month's leave at the end of the course, as would appear from the recommendation of the Superintending Engineer. I request that Government will be pleased to pass definite orders on this question.

Sub: Applications from Messrs T.Lakshmanan and K.Rangachari, Upper subordinate students for exemption from completing the course.

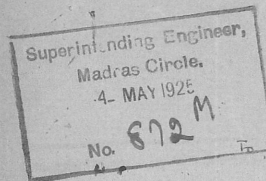

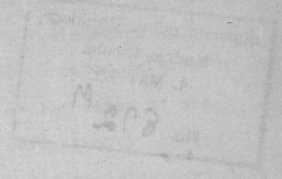

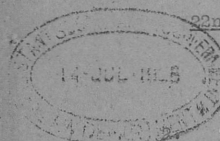

The Chief Engineer concurs in the view expressed in para 2 of the Director of Public Instruction's letter and does not agree with the Superintending Engineer in the view that the students' course may be considered to have been satisfactorily completed on the dates on which they proceeded on leave. The dates of completion of the course should be exactly 12 months from the dates they joined for practical training or such longer period by which their course may have been extended either for unsatisfactory work or for availing leave in excess of 30 days.

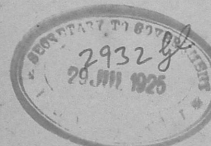
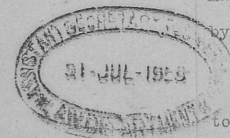

Rule 67 of the Rules relating to the working of the College of Engineering, Guindy, runs as follows : -

"67. Leave may be granted during the practical course for a period or aggregate of periods not exceeding one month per annum. When leave in excess of one month is granted, the practical course shall be extended by a period equal to the excess over one month per annum of the leave granted."

2. The question is raised whether, in case the leave is not availed of, it will help to obtain a reduction in the prescribed period of practical training to be undergone by the Engineer Class and Upper Subordinate Class students with reference to rules 17 and 22 of the rules. Rule 79 says that the practical course will extend over a complete year. The Director of Public Instruction is also inclined to the view that the full prescribed period of practical training should be insisted on and that the provision for leave contained in Rule 67 does not create a right to have the period of training reduced to the extent of the leave not availed of. The Chief Engineer agrees with the Director. As the Director asks for a clear ruling on the matter this may be provided for in the College Rules by inserting a foot-note to rule 67.

3. A draft order is submitted. It may be sent to the P.W.D. for acceptance before issue. (The case of the two students reported in the Superintending Engineer's letter need not be considered as the dates of their discharge have already expired.)
