I have the honour to submit herewith copy of
letter No. O.R. 1152/1924-25 dated 1st May 1925, from
the President, South Kanara District Co-operative
Council of Supervision, requesting me to address
Government to permit M.R.R., U. L. Mangesha Rao Ayl.,
B.A., L.T., Head Master, Government Elementary Training
School, Mangalore to take up the honorary post of the
Secretary of the District Co-operative Council of
Supervision. One of his duties as Secretary will be to

with the Journal of co-operation entitled the "Kannada Sanakari".
The journal is printed at the Sadananda Co-operative Printing
Works Ltd., Mangalore, South Kanara which is a society registered
under the Co-operative Societies Act II of 1912. In G.O.No. 142, (T)
Home, Education, dated 29th January 1920, Mr. Mangesha Rao was
exempted from the operation of supplementary Local Rules (iii)
under rule 12 and (ii) under rule 14(old) so as to permit him to,
undertake the honorary duties of the Secretary of the Mangalore
Co-operative Union on condition that it entails no interference
with his official work. Mr. Mangesha Rao has given up his post
as Secretary of the Mangalore Co-operative Union and he is in a
position to take up the post of the Secretary of the District
Council of Supervision without prejudice to his official duties.
The duties of the Secretary of the District Council are set
forth in by-law 21 (b) of the by-laws of the Council, a copy of
which is enclosed for reference. If Mr. Mangesha Rao is permitted
to take up the post of the Secretary of the Council, it will
certainly further the cause of co-operation in South Kanara District.
I have consulted the Director of Public Instruction in the matter
and he has agreed to the proposal. I enclose herewith a copy of
his letter R.O.C.No. 900-C/25 dated the 7th July 1925. I have the
honour to request that Government will be pleased to permit
Mr. Mangesha Rao under rules 14 and 18, to take up the duties of
the Secretary of the District Council of Supervision, South Kanara
and to edit the Kannada Sanakari. I request the favour of early
orders.

Copy of letter O.R.No.1152/24-25 dated 1st May 1925
from the President, S.Kanara District Co-operative Council
of Supervision, to the Registrar of Co-operative Societies,
Madras through the Assistant Registrar of Co-operative
Societies, Mangalore.

In the Business conference (general body meeting of
this council) held at Mangalore on the 24th and 25th ultimo,
it has been resolved to change the headquarters of the
Council from Puttur to Mangalore. The idea of the trans-
fer of the headquarters has been suggested by the inability
of Mr. Ananta Rau, the present Secretary, to find sufficient
time to attend to the work of the Council in the midst of
the heavy and growing volume of work in the Central Bank.
None other can be found here. Mr. Mangesh Rau, B.A.L.T.,
Head-master, Government Higher Elementary Training School,
Mangalore, is a pillar of strength of the Co-operative
Movement in the district, having been connected with it
from over a decade. He has been the heart and soul of
the Mangalore Local Co-operative Union ever since it was
started. Recently, however, other suitable workers having
come forward, the responsibility has been shifted to their
shoulders, and Mr. Mangesh Rau is quite free now. One of
the important functions of the Council Secretary is to conduct
its organ--the "Kannada Sahakari"--which is printed and
published in Mangalore. It would be quite easy for Mr.
Mangesh Rau to undertake the editing and publication of
the Journal as he has already established for himself a
name in Kanarese literary circles. The other work of the
Council which at present is not much and awaits develop-
ment at the hands of enthusiasts like Mr. Mangesh Rau can
also be easily looked after by him without any detriment
to his own work in the Training School.

2. Mr. Mangesh Rau's association with the movement has
been productive of happy results in the past, as he has
been already been instrumental in rousing the interest and

and enthusiasm of many a pupil teacher in the movement, and in the future also we are most anxious that the association should be continued as far as possible. He has been induced to take up the Office of the Secretary of the Council, but since the permission of the Government has to be obtained for the purpose as well as for his editing the journal, the "Kannada-Sahakari", I am addressing this communication to you.

3. Mr. Mangesh Rau had formerly been given permission to take up the office of Secretary of the Mangalore Co-operative Union. As he has ceased to be the Secretary, the permission granted formerly has only to be transferred, so to say, so as to apply to the District Council. Though editing the "Kannada-Sahakari" is one of the important duties connected with the office of the secretary, if special permission is deemed necessary therefor, I request that it may also be separately obtained.

4. The Council office has to be shifted from here before the beginning of the monsoon which commences early in June. Hence this letter may kindly be treated as urgent. As you know Mr. Mangesh Rau as well as his work and also the circumstances under which we are obliged to utilise his services, I do not propose to say anything more. I trust you will, if necessary and convenient, speak to the Director of Public Instruction and see that the matter is expedited so that the necessary orders may be passed by Government before the close of this month.

21. Subject to such resolutions as the Executive Committee may from time to time pass, the several officers of the Council shall have the following powers and functions:-

(a) The President and in his absence, the Vice-President shall have a general control over all the affairs of the Council.

(b) The Secretary shall be responsible for all the executive work of the Council including the maintenance of accounts, and the safe custody of all the moneys, documents, goods and other property of the Council. In all legal proceedings relating to the Council, the Council shall be represented by the Secretary.

(c) Remittances intended for the Council shall be addressed to the Secretary and he shall have authority to receive them. All deposit or overdraft accounts that are opened in the name of the Council shall be operated upon by the Secretary.

Reference:-M.R.Ry U.L.Mangesh Rao, Headmaster, Government training school, Mangalore--proposal to take up the Honorary post of Secretary of the District Co-operative Council of supervision-South Kanara.

With reference to the correspondence ending with your letter No.B.1733/25 dated 21st June 1925, I have the honour to inform you that I agree to the proposal. If, however, experience shows that the proposed work interferes with M.R.Ry.U.L.Mangesh Rao's duties as Headmaster, he will have to give it up.

2. The copy of the bylaws of the Council of supervision sent to me along with your above letter is herewith returned.
