M.R.Ry., M.A. Appaswami Ayyar, retired Deputy Inspector of Schools, Kadambur Range, was formerly a permanent Supervisor of Elementary Schools on Rs.50 plus 15 and sub-pro-tem Deputy Inspector of Schools on Rs.93³/₄ from 1-4-20 to 1-3-22 and was thereafter confirmed in the latter cadre as 1st Assistant, Government Training School, Villupuram. When the initial pay of the members of the Deputy Inspectors' Cadre was fixed in the revised scale in May '23, the retired Deputy Inspector in question was given an initial pay of Rs.100/- on 1-3-22 in the ordinary grade of the Deputy Inspectors cadre under Rule 1 of the annexure to G.O.No.711

G.O.No.711 Finance dated 11-7-21 as he was drawing an officiating pay of Rs.93 $\frac{3}{4}$ throughout the three months prior to 1-3-21. He has also drawn three increments and has retired with effect from 20-5-25. But the Accountant-General has now informed me in his letter No.Edn.1-161 dated 18-5-25 (after a lapse of exactly two years from the date of the fixing of the initial pay of the Deputy Inspectors) that his pay in the Deputy Inspectors' Cadre should be regulated by Fundamental Rule 32 as he held only a Secondary Grade teachers' Post as his permanent appointment on 1-3-22. When the Deputy Inspectors' initial pay was originally fixed in May 1923 he was treated as a permanent member of the Deputy Inspectors' cadre as he actually held a permanent appointment in the said cadre at that time, having been confirmed with effect from 1-3-22 and his initial pay was, therefore, fixed at Rs.100/- from 1-3-22. Now according to the Accountant-General's objection, the retired Deputy Inspector has to refund a sum of Rs.311-2-0 and it is very hard to call upon ^{him} to refund this huge amount. Further the Accountant-General's instructions were received only just after the Deputy Inspector's retirement and there was no possibility of recovering any part of the excess while on duty. I have, therefore, the honour to request that Government may be pleased to waive the excess under para 2(4) of G.O.No.Mis.647 Finance dated 6-9-24.

2. The pension application has been already revised in the light of the above facts and in anticipation of the approval by Government of the above recommendations.
