Sir,

I have the honour to state that the Correspondent L.M.C. High school, Shiyali has introduced Manual training in wood work, rattan work, spinning and weaving, book binding and Meccano in the school and that the classes have been working successfully, since last September.

2. Instruction is given to about 40 pupils of forms I to VI in each subject for 2 periods a week.

3. Mr. Porrett who scrutinized the scheme does not recommend Meccano which he says is only a kindergarten occupation.

4. The recurring and non-recurring charges of the four classes put together amount to Rs.585 and Rs.263 respectively as detailed in the margin.

Sir,

In continuation of this office letter R.C.No.905-E/24 dated 22-8-24, I have the honour to state that the Correspondent, L.M.C.High School, Shiyali, has now changed his proposal regarding the introduction of Manual training in the school.

At present there are only 3 classes working in it viz., woodwork, spinning and mat-weaving.

2. The number of pupils attending each of the three classes referred to above is 54, 36 and 28 respectively the pupils attending each class receiving 2 hours' instruction per week.

3. As regards spinning, the Correspondent reports that it has been introduced with a view to training pupils in the art of spinning fine yarns and that weaving will be introduced at the beginning of the next school-year.

Although spinning by itself has no educational value, I request that it may not be objected to as it is proposed to add weaving next year, to which spinning will become ancillary.

I, therefore, recommend that the management may be given a half grant of Rs.632 during the current year, the expenditure being met from the provision of Rs.76,100 under "31.B(b)-Education-Secondary-Direct grants to non-Government Secondary Schools-grants for Vocational and pro-vocational training" in the Budget Estimate for the current year.

The D.P.I. states that the manual training classes in this case have been working since September 1923. The recurring & non recurring charges of the classes are reported to amount to ~~Rs 585~~ Rs 85 and Rs 263, respectively. It is not clear to which year these charges relate. The classes were not opened with the sanction of govt and it is not possible to sanction a grant for the charges incurred in past years. The D.P.I. may be consulted wr. as to what the charges are in the current year & what grant should be paid to the school. He may ^{also} be requested to furnish details of the recurring charges.

Manual training classes in the L.M.C. high school, Shigela have been working since September 1923. The management D.P.I. reports that the management have now modified their scheme for the imparting of instruction in manual training in the school and that only three classes are working with the school, viz. Woodwork, Spinning and mat-weaving. The recurring and non-recurring charges of all the classes for the current year, as submitted by the Adviser to Govt. on Manual Training are Rs. 993 and 270 respectively. As the classes have been working from 1923, full recurring charges for 1925 may be allowed in calculating the grant payable to the school. A half grant may be sanctioned to the school for the classes. As a first order is submitted which may be sent to Finance for acceptance.
